If massive non-white immigration continues, whites will become a minority in the United States. This would transform our nation and sweep away our way of life.

Already whites refuse to live in those parts of the country where blacks or Hispanics are the majority. Why must we turn more parts of America into places where we would not want to live? We must not leave to our grandchildren a Third-World nation with a Third-World population.
