ARMED FORCES AND ATOMIC CONTROL

Yow can nations feel secure from attack so long as nations around them are heavily armed? How can tions agree to disarm unless they feel secure from atk? The twin problems of security and disarmament form a vicious circle. For some while, the United Nations has attacked this circle by the only method that is appliently possible at present,—by nibbling away simultane sly at various portions of its circumference. During the past month, especially, this effort has constituted the most conspicuous, though not the most fruitful, feature of U.N. a vivities. Its outstanding feature was its clear presentation of the basic principles on which there must be agreement before a .U.N. armed force can be established. 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
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

Reference is made to the attached memorgadum from the Director, dated September 20, 1947, which refers to interviews conducted in this case at night time.

You will recall that when the original group was interviewed in Washington in April, 1947, these interviews were conducted after working hours, either at the subjects' homes or in the field office. This procedure was decided upon since it was not deemed advisable to interview subjects at their places of employment in the day time, particularly those then employed in Government offices.

The Director in the attached memorandum has instructed that in the future when interviews are conducted for information purposes only and the persons interviewed are not subject to arrest, that the interviews be conducted in the day time and preferably in field offices or at the place of business of the person to be interviewed.

The Director further instructed that the field offices be informed of these instructions for further guidance.

There is attached hereto a Bureau Bulletin setting out the Bureau's policy in connection with interviews of persons not subject to arrest.

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



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




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Why Does Not Mr. Wallace Give Us The Specific Details?

In his speech in Philadelphia Mr. Henry A. Wallace declared that the FBI is conducting a campaign of terror against "liberal" Government employés that is "reminiscent of the early days of Adolf Hitler." According to Mr. Wallace old friends and coworkers of his in Washington report that employés are being awakened in the middle the night and interrogated at great ngth.

This is a serious charge that should not lightly dismissed, whoever the employes y be. But obviously no action is possible the generalizations that Mr. Wallace preked to his audience in Philadelphia. What eeeded are names and dates and detailed ounts of the alleged actions of the FBI. the situation is as bad as Mr. Wallace s it is then, surely, he and his friends hould see that the facts are provided. Indeed, if Mr. Wallace is convinced in his

own mind that the FBI is guilty of conduct reminiscent of the early days of Hitler, it is surprising that he has not himself taken the nitiative in assembling the evidence and referring direct charges instead of being content merely to indulge in generalities.

The item reads as follows: MA State Department official with the rank of Ambassador and a Government employee who worked on the Los Alamos atomic project are under investigation as members of a Communist espionage ring, it was learned today. "Picked Department of Justice Agents are not only presenting evidence to the special Grand Jury in New York City on these persons, but on other Washington officials who are part of a Soviet conspiracy to steal America's top military secret. "In New York the Grand Jury reconvened today at the Foley Square Court House and subpoenas have been issued for witnesses to appear today, tomorrow and Friday. High local representatives of the Communist Party are reported on the subpoena list. "It is known that J. Edgar Hoover, FHI Director, plans about twenty-five indictments before the special Grand Jury before the end of the year, despite efforts of Democratic party leaders to have the disclosures postponed until after the R Presidential election next year. *Also involved in the Grand Jury investigations is a State Department official who is known to have been a leader of the Communist Party cell setup in Washington a decade ago by Harold Ware, member of the Red Fascist Central Committee. "This cell' was planned by Russian Secret Police Agents for the sole purpose of gathering any and all information valuable to the Soviets. By a secret courier system, the information was centralized by the 'cell' members and taken to the Russian 100 Lange 65 - 56402 - 2883 Embassy. "The State Department official the suspected of aiding the plot to pass this confidential information on to the Russians was a Presidential adviser at the Falta and Potsdam Conferences and at San Francisco." Mr. Belmont advised that they thought possibly the State Department official to whom he is referring may be Laughlin Currie, a subject in the Gregory case.

Reference is made to the attached clipping from "Pi" dated Coctober 20, 1947 entitled hat's Behind 'Leak' of Red Hunt Secrets?".75-113 His article which was written by I. F. Stone stated that the author had learned from persons who had been questioned that the methods used in connection with their questioning was that two FI men questioned the suspect without a stenographer and then asked him later to sign an account of the inquiry as recalled by the Agents. Stone said that if the person questioned protested that the account given him to sign was not accurate, he was told that it would be "your word against ours" — one suspect against two FBI men. He went on to state that one of those questioned spent most of a day in a frank talk with Agents and then was dismayed at the report he was asked to sign of the purported conversation. The suspect claimed that it was inaccurate and refused to put his name to it.

Another part of the article said that a minor Government employee of old American stock was appealed to on the ground that he wasn't like the "riff-raff who had just come over."

You penned a notation to the article asking "what do we know about references to us and the interviews?".

As to the methods used in questioning subjects, you may recall that the Field was instructed that two Agents should be present during the conduct of interviews with subjects. It is believed that Stone made reference to the interview had with Harold Glasser, a Treasury Department employee who was interviewed by two Agents of the Washington Field Office immediately upon his return to this country from an assignment abroad. He was interviewed originally at his convenience in the Washington Field Office on April 30, 1947 from 10:00 A.M. to 11:45 A.M. at which time it was necessary for him to leave due to a prior commitment. He agreed to return at his convenience to continue to the interview.

He was again interviewed on May 3, 1947 at the Washington Field Office from 10:12 A.M. to 12:25 P.M. Thereafter a statement was prepared and on May 7, 1947 he was requested to come to the Washington Field Office to sign this statement. He appeared at the Field Office at 2:00 P.M. the same day and read a prepared statement 8 pages in length. After reading the statement, he stated that he would rather call the meetings he attended with a man named anticipate. "social worker meetings" instead of Communist Party meetings.

He also stated that he had not said that he was a member of the American League Against War and Fascism, but that he may have been a member. Glasser refused to sign the statement unless the changes were made in these two instances. The interviewing agents asked Glasser if he would sign the statement if the changes were made, although it was pointed out to him that he had made the statements as set out by them, and he said that he had talked to his attorney and would not sign the statement even if the changes were made. He also made stipulations to the effect that he would like his attorney to have a copy of the statement, etc. In view of his attitude, the changes were not made and the interview was terminated at 2:30 P.M. at which time Glasser left the office.

Stone's reference to a minor Government employee of old American stock who was appealed to on the ground that he wasn't like the "riff-raff who had just come over" could possibly be <u>Duncan C. Lee</u>, a former employee of OSS who is from a family of old American stock, the Lees being an old Virginia family.

Lee was interviewed on 'ay 29, 1947 in his law office in Washington by Special Agents Charles G. Cleveland and W. Raymond Wannall of the Washington Field Office. Special Agent Wannall, who is presently assigned to the Pureau, has advised that in a proaching Lee they mentioned that both he and his family were an American family of many generations and that his interest in the welfare of the country was the same as those of the Agents interviewing him. Tannall stated that the word "riff-raff" was not used by the Agents and neither was any comparison made between Lee and any of the other subjects. In fact, none of the other subjects were mentioned directly or by inference.

It would appear from this article that the subjects are furnishing information to such writers as Stone in an effort to discredit the Fureau and the Department so that they can build up a defense for themselves in order to sway the public and members of the Grand Jury.



CATHERINE HURLEY had a lengthy conversation with DORIS PLENN. in which they discussed such individuals as DEWITT ELDRIDGE of George Washington University and his wife, HOPE, ANNE KYDD of the King Smith School, MARTIN POPPER, of the National Lawyers' Guild, and others. The chief topic of conversation on this occasion concerned the fall lecture series which is being organized at the King Smith School. CATHERINE pointed out that ANNE KYDD has arranged some seventeen lectures, including very interesting people from "Fascists to Communists" and among the speakers scheduled to lecture are such persons as MORRIS ERNST, LEON BERKHEAD (phonetic), MARTIN POPPER, ROBERT WEAVER, CLAUDE PEPPER and BOB TAFT. It is to be noted that CATHERINE HURLEY is considered generally pro-Communist and there has been considerable indication that the political philosophy course at the King Smith School, which last year was conducted by PAIMER WEBER, also of interest in this case, appeared to have a strongly pro-Communist bent. It is further noted that DEWITT ELDRIDGE and MARTIN POPPER have been of considerable interest in the GREGORY investigation and both of them appear to have strong pro-Communist sentiments.

October 4, 1947

CATHERINE HURLEY had a conversation with ABEL and DORIS PLENN, at which time CATHERINE asked DORIS to tell her about a meeting to be held that evening in Chevy Chase. DORIS explained the meeting was to be held at 3736 Kanawha Street, which is the residence of MARK and EUGENIA BAKER, both of whom have previously been identified as Communist sympathisers. DORIS commented that the meeting is in honor of Mrs. MANNING, who is in Washington under the auspices of the American Abraham Lincoln Brigade. MANNING is apparently identical with the British member of Parliament who has been in the United States speaking in favor of the anti-Franco forces.

On this same date, GREGORY DOIBIN, of the Russian Embassy, spoke to ABEL PLENN and indicated he wished to see him. It was agreed that Mr. and Mrs. DOIBIN would visit the PLENNs at their spertment on the following evening. This meeting was covered by physical surveillance and confirmed the aforementioned plans. October 5, 1947

ABEL PLENN spoke to MERCER COOK of Howard University. The conversation was quite long and friendly and indicated that PLENN is continuing his friendly relationship with COOK. It is to be noted that COOK includes a number of Communist sympathizers and suspected Communists among his friends and associates. It is also of interest to note that in this conversation PLENN commented that he expected to be in Washington for about ten days, after which time he and his wife definitely expect to move to New York City.

Reference is made to the attached article by Howard Bushmore entitled, "Red on Senator's Staff Probed". The article mentions that

Department of Justice agents are investigating the activities of a Washington left-winger who is on the staff of a prominent Democratic Senator. It stated that the investigation is part of the special Grand Jury inquiry into Soviet Espionage. The article states that evidence has been ebtained showing that the Senator's employee was in contact with members of the underground "cell" maintained by the Communication Washington. It said that this employee worked with other "Reds" who had worsed their way into executive jobs in various Government Agencies and that "cell" was formed as a "clearing house" for military information. It went on to state that each member of the "cell" was assigned a job of stealing documents, blueprints, and copying diplomatic reports which were brought to weakly "cell" meetings and then turned over to a courier who relayed them to the Bussian Embassy.

Mention was made of secret meetings at a farm near Quakertown, Pennsylvania, which served as a center for the espionage ring and was used as a "mail drop" during the war by Communist agents at the Los Alamos Atomic Project.

In conclusion the article stated that a national officer of the CIO, who has often been regarded as the "brain truster" of the CIO's Communist minority, was working closely with this Communist unit.

You attached a routing slip and inquired, "What are the facts regarding this?"

You may recall that on October 9, 1947, James Walter of the Washington "Times Herald" turned over to Mr. Nichols a blind memorandum concerning numerous subjects in the Gregory Case and other individuals previously reported as active in a Communist underground parallel in the 1930's. The contents of this memorandum were substantially the same as the information furnished the Bureau by Whittaker Chambers in 1942, when Chambers acted as a courier for Alexander Stevens, alias J. Peters. Chambers mentioned, among others active in this underground parallel, the name of Charles Kramer, a subject in the Gregory Case and presently a close associate and advisor to Senator Clauds Pepper of Florida. Another name mentioned by him was Lee Pressman presently council for the CIO. Although Pressman is not a subject in the Gregory Case, he is being investigated in that case as a contact of numerous subjects.

It is believed that Rushmore referred to Kramer in the first part of his article as the "left-winger who is on the staff of a prominent Democratic Senator," and further referred to Pressman in the last paragraph of his article as the "individual who is working closely with this Communist unit" and whom he described as a "national officer of the CIO." James Walter's blind memorandum also mentioned a woman named Hedda or Hetta Cumperts whose husband's name is Paul Massing, a member of the German Communist Party. The Gumperts were described as having a farm near Quakertown, Pennsylvania. You may recall that Hedi and Paul Massing are known Soviet Espionage Agents and they have been thoroughly and exhaustively interviewed by our Net York Office and have furnished considerable and valuable information relative to Soviet Espionage.

This farm at Quakertown, Pennsylvania is undoubtedly the one referred to in the article by Rushmore.

Mr. Nichols advised in his memorandum to Mr. Tolson dated October 10, 1947, that Ed/Nellor of the "New York Sun" was cognisant of the memorandum in James Walter's possession.

It is possible, therefore, that Howard Rushmore may have gotten his information from Nellor or Walters or some other members of the staff of their papers. It appears, however, that he has exaggerated and has resorted to some guesswork as to the extent and identity of the positions held by the persons involved in the Grand Jury investigation.
