The following information concerning the subject's activities was obtained from

On May 16, 1946, REBEKAH FITZGERALD contacted ED and JANF STONE at which time she advised ED FITZGERALD was going to New York on the following day and consequently they would be unable to visit the STONES. ED FITZGERALD's father has been very ill and for this reason he has been making numerous trips to New York within the past month. His parents live at 1205 East 35th Street, Brooklyn, New York, phone Cloverdale 82350.

On May 19, 1946, MABEL AME.TON told REBEKAH FITZGERALD she and RALFH had just returned from a meeting and brought back with them a package of little things, also some newspaper stuff. She mentioned Mr. AISDOM, (phonetic) the art collector; Mr. GARFMAN, the artist; and several Associated Press men were there. She said Mr. PERKINS is now at Asheville, North Carolina. MABEL and MALPH had visited the University of Virginia where they met Mr. MALLY, the curator of rare books. He is an alumnus of Princeton and Oxford Universities and has spent some time in the interior of China. MABEL WHEATON is a sister of THOMAS MOLFE, the author.

On May 20, 1916, ELIZABETH FRAZER of Philadelphia advised REBEKAH FITZCERALD that ASABELLA and FOLLY have made her a very attractive offer to go into the bookshop with them, but she would not make up her mind until she could discuss the matter fully with REBEKAH. ELIZABETH mentioned she had recently returned from the "settlement" meeting at Niagara Falls where a speaker in describing the atomic bomb situation stated we had been caught with our pants down.

On May 20, 1946, EDWARD FITZGERALD advised his wife his father's condition was still very serious, and that he was going to stay over in New York for another night and requested that she contact HASKELL and tell him ED would be in on Wednesday or Thursday. FITZGERALD also told his wife JENNY MILLER had contacted him the previous night and wanted to know if there was anything she could do.

On May 22, 1946, LANE STONE invited the FITZGER.LDS to her home on the following evening. REBEKAH was unable to accept the invitation until she ascertained whether ED would be home by that time. They then made a tentative date for the following week-end. JANE advised REBEKAH she was going out west sometime this summer and invited REBEKAH to go along with her at least part way and return by train.

On May 24, 1946, REBEKAH advised her husband the STONES would be over to their house that evening.

On May 28, 1946, EDWARD FITZGERALD contacted MAGDOFF and advised Secretary WALIACE was leaving town for the rest of the week to make up his mind, indicating that WALIACE might resign. He mentioned he might see ELEANOR and MORGENTHAU while he was away.





These records also indicated that RIPS wife TIMA LOWERIPS is the daughter of an attorney in the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

At Stones Hercantile Igency, 1419 H Street, N.W. the records indicated in addition to the above that RIPS is approximately 38 years of age and has been employed since April, 1946 as economic adviser to the Greek Supply Hission, 2362 Hassachusetts Avenue, N.W.



It was also determined that both SERGE RIPS and ALLEN ROSENDERG were formerly employed in the European Branch of the Foreign Exonomics Administration.



In a preceding paragraph of this report, it was noted that SERGE RIPS was married to TIMA IO E RIPS, whose father was reported to be an attorney in the Department of Agriculture.





It was also ascertained a letter was addressed to Mr. BELA GOLD at the above address by Captain H. ZAP. This letter bore U. S. Army Postal Service date April 4, 1946, return address of the sender being indicated as Captain H. A.P., 0-579,750, Finance Div., ORGUS, APO 742, care Postmaster, New York. (The organization indicated is believed to be OMGUS rather than ORGUS.)

It is to be noted that the name ZAP has previously occurred in connection with subject WILLIAM L. ULLIANN who was in Germany at the offices of Military Government, Finance Division, on January 26, 1946. Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated larch 28, 1946, at Washington, D. Physical Surveillance

A spot surveillance maintained on the home of the GOLDS during the period indicated reflected there were people living in the house, and on May 31, 1946, surveillance revealed a woman believed to be Mrs. GOLD was airing the child in the yard of the house, and it was believed from other evidences of activity that other people were in the house.

Under postmark of May 2, 1946, Mrs. GREGG received a letter from Mrs. HAROLD (ROSE) TRAILER of 117 Greenville Drive, Silver Springs, Maryland which set forth the names of various books considered appropriate for Jewish kindergarten, first and second grade children.

Under date of May 17, 1946 JOSEFH B. GREGG received a letter from NELSON A ROCKEFELLER, room 5600, 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York City, which made an appointment for GREGG at 12:30 p.m., May 23, 1946. The letter further requested GREGG to contact his secretary, Mrs. ROLFINS, at Circle 7-3700 for the purpose of advising her whether or not this arrangement would be satisfactory.

Mrs. ROBERT WEBE of 1474 Columbia Hoad, N.W., Washington, D. C. directed an announcement of the marriage of her daughter HARRIET WEBE LIBBY to Mr. and Mrs. JOSIPH BY GREGG under date of May 6, 1946.

A letter postmarked April 28, 1946 was addressed to JOSEPH B. GREGG by ROSE STEIN, 5234 (?) East 4th Street, Cincinnati, Ohio. The letter was social in nature and it is believed ROSE GREENSTEIN is GREGG's sister or sisterin-law.

Attention is invited to information supplied by Confidential Informant on April 26, 1946 as regards individuals named FLORA and LARVINGERTRUM (ph) who were stated to be in Washington, D. C. and in the process of returning to Puffalo, New York.





There is being set out below a summarization of the information supplied by Confidential Informant during the period of May 16 to May 31 inclusive.

On May 17, 1946 JOSEPH GREGG conferred with BRUCE WAYBUR of the United Electrical Workers. These individuals agreed to get together the early part of the coming week at which time it was mentioned that MABUR resides at 803 M. Wayne Street, Arlington, Virginia, telpehone number Glebe 4880. During the course of the conference MEGG inquired as to whether MATBUR has been doing any lobbying. MAYBUR replied he had not done much lobbying as yet but some of the U.E. people spent all their time on this type of work. MAYBUR mentioned that he talked to one of the United Automobile workers men and ascertained they have prospects for several jobs. He stated that in the event GREGG is interested in going to Detroit, Michigan on one of these jobs he, MAYBUR, will put him in touch with IRVING MICHTER.

On May 11, 1946 JOSEFH GREGG informed MINTER DOD of the State Department that he would see him around 12:00 noon.

Shortly subsequent to the above, G.EGG again conferred with MOOD and inquired whether 700D would object to his using his telephone number in connection with an advertisement GRIGG intends to put in the paper in order to obtain an automobile. He advised LOOD that he did not want anybody to know the phone he was using in connection with this ad. GREGG and WOOD discussed an offer received by GREGG from FRINK JELLIFECK to use the mailing list and the prestige of the old Hemisphere Corporation. GREGG apparently is not in favor of becoming a Washington representative for the company which JELLINECK will operate from Mexico City, Lexico in asmuch as sufficient remuneration was not involved. GREGG inquired as to the welfare of MOOD's friend, namely FRANK FOR LL of "Morld Report" whereupon WOOD asked whether GREGG had been in touch with NELSON ROCKEFELLER of Herico City. GREGG advised he is waiting for an appointment with ROCKEFELLER and expects to go to New York City in the latter part of the week as he had a number of things to look into. GREGG mentioned he expects to get his money due him from the State Department in the near future at which time he will take care of WOOD. (Apparently WOOD is loaning money to GREGG).

On the same day an unidentified maid attempted to reich JOSEPH GREGG. He conversed with the maid at the GREGG home, whereupon she inquired "wren't you the man who was supposed to call?" The man answered in the affirmative and the maid said that lie. GREGG had told her that he would be unable to meet the man.

On May 19, 1946, ROSE MEGG ingaged in a social conversation with her mother at Fairmont 2346, London, Ontario, Canada. She also talked to her sister, Mrs. RUTH APPEL, and stated that she would come to Canada around the 15th of June.

Additional data supplied by the informant on May 19 reveals that VIOLA SHAW (ROSE GREGG's sister) conversed with JOSEPH and ROSE GREGG to advise that ROSE's mether believes it would be better if the GREGGS found a summer place in the states rather than coming to Canada. In this connection, ROSE's mother feels that she can manage auth APERL ROSE GREGG is not around.

ROSE GREGG conformed with her sister, LLRY, at Canistop 92, New York, on May 20, 1946.

Later in the day EVELYM EIN informed JOSEPH GREGG that she is inviting several people to her home on Saturday night. She invited hr. and Hrs. GREGG. GREGG also advised that he was going to New York City on the following day to see a few people in addition to the LEON KAHN suggested by LRZINI. GREGG was to pick up the letter of introduction to KLHN at MINZLNI's office in the lashington auditorium at 19th and E Streets, N.J. It was also determined that the land GREGG, MARZINI, and RICHTER were purchasing in Virginia is being handled through the firm of Simends and Culler, Court House Square, Arlington, Virginia.

ROSE GREGG conformed with her husband JOSEPH GREGG on May 22 at which time he stated that he would have to see C.RL BARZANI before leaving for New York City.

Later in the day, FRANK JELLINFOK of New York City attempted to reach JOSEPH GREEG. Mrs. GREEG stated that her humband had left for New York City and could be contacted at the home of her uncle, MATHIELERMAN, 21 Lontgomery Place, Brooklyn, New York, telephone Main 2-2118.

On the 23rd of May, EVELYM EIN inquired of ROSE GREGG as to whether the GREEGS intended to come to her house on Saturday night.

Subsequent to the above, C.R. There is no information concerning IRVING GOIDMAN and HANNH GOLDMAN in the Washington Field Office indices other than data which has been reported in connection with instant case.

It is also noted in the case entitled "FREDERICK PALMER LIBER ET AL; INTERNAL SECURITY - C", that according to a report of Special Agent L. L. TYLER dated April 11, 1944 at Washington, !. C., a letter was directed to Mr. and Mrs. FRED LEBER under date of April 3, 1941, which letter bore the return address "Suite 701, 900 17th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C." This address is listed to DR. ISIDORE ALPHER, a physician.

According to the report of Special Agent NED P. HOLMAN, JR., dated at Washington, D. C., June 19, 1942, in the case entitled "THE NORTH AMERICAN COMMITTEE TO AID SPANISH DEMOCRACY, AMSHINGTON FRIENDS OF SPANISH DEMOCRACY, OPANISH REFUGEE RELIEF CAMPAIGN, INTERNAL SECURITY - C", ISIDORE M. ALPHER, according to the letterhead of this organization, is listed as a local sponsor.

There is being set out below a summarization of the data supplied by Confidential Informant during the period of May 16, 1946 to May 31, 1946, inclusive.

On May 16, 1946, MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with GEORGE TAREE, a writers' agent, who resides in New Cannan, Connecticut, telephone 9-1887, and maintains an office in New York City, telephone Murray Hill 2-8775. These individuals discussed articles which HALPERIN has prepared for publication, namely "Behind the Blue Book Failure" and "The Bankruptcy of the Good Neighbor Policy". HYE has been unable to sell these articles to any magazines as yet. BYE stated, however, that Whittlesey House wants a book written on "Secretaries of State". Consequently, BYE suggested HALPERIN as the possible author. HYE added that the publisher is considering JOHN FRANKLIN CARTER as the author of this book, but HALPERIN might have a chance in the event CARTER has previous commitments.

Inter in the day, May 16th, MAURICE HALPERIN attempted to reach LOUIS REAM of the American Red Cross.

Subsequent to the above, THEODORE HALPERIN, brother of MAURICE HALPERIN, who has come to Washington, D. C. from Boston, Massachusetts, conferred with ANGUS McDONAID, who is employed by "World Report". These individuals agreed to have lunch on instant date.

Additional data developed by Informant on May 16, 1986 in leates that BOB ROGERS conferred with MURICE HALPERIN, at which time they discussed efforts on the part of WILLMOORD RENDALL to get rid of ROGERS. In this connection, ROGERS advised he obtained information from ROBERT AICHARDSON which indicates that the story is not "as pat" as it was previously reported to him. With this in view, ROGERS will be unable to bring "per se" charges against KENDALL. ROGERS continued by advising that RHEINER (phonetic), is dodging him and JUST (phonetic) has been on a tour of inspection. ROGERS further related that JUST and his boss are handling re-organization matters as WILLIAM LANGER will have nothing to do with the "inheritance decisions". ROGERS commented that he is presently at the offices of P. R. Associates, Inc., "otherwise I wouldn't be talking like this".

Also on May 16th LOUIS REAM conferred with MAURICE HALFERIN, at which time HALPERIN invited REAM to Tunch at the Cosmos Club on May 22nd.

BOB ROGERS re-conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN on May 16th to advise that he spent half an hour with ALLMOORE KENDALL, SHERIAM KENT and ALLAN EVANS. He related that WOODROW BORAH was also called before the tribunal at which time both he and BORAH were requested to resign for the good of the service.

HALPERIN inquired "for the usual reasons?" and ROGERS replied in the affirmative. ROGERS then stated KENDALL made his usual attack on HALPERIN. HALPERIN asked if the attack on BORAH and ROGERS had the full concurrence of KENT.

ROGERS replied that it did. In this connection, KENT faced ROGERS with the possibility of down-grading which would be necessary, inasmuch as ROLAND HUSSEY, who is taking over, is only a P-7. HALPERIN was surprised that KENT actually led the attack, to which ROGERS replied, "Yeah, your friend, your buddy from the brush factory."

ROGERS stated he told them that he had nothing to fear as he had been an honest man all his life and has never been a member of anything except two unions. ROGERS further advised that BOR/H would give the same answers but apparently acquitted himself very well. ROGERS stated that in his opinion, KENDALL, EVANS and KENT are "playing security" council and he doesn't believe they have the authority. ROGERS thinks that they were instructed to proceed against BORAH and himself. He stated that there are two lies on his record which have never been expunged. ROGERS further believes that KENDALL will be able to hold on and become part of TILLIAM LANGER'S staff.

According to ROGERS, SHERLIAN KENT will head the staff under LANGER in spite of the fact that he has always been of the opinion that LANGER does not think much of KENT. ROGERS is concerned, as he believes LANGER is obviously dodging him and involved in the conspiracy to prevent his, ROGERS, airing the whole matter. ROGERS inquired as to whether he should try to see LANGER at his home in an effort to point out to him that "his people there stink and that they do not handle these things right". Tith reference to this, ROGERS believes he has two grounds of approach, one "is the big issue of human and civil rights which I should champion but I don't think it's worthwhile

because I don't think the organization is going to survive. The other issue is one of being decent gentlemen and following out orders that come from above and I take great and lengthy objections to that." HYLPERIN advised ROGERS to give LANGER a ring and not to bother negotiating with the others inasmuch as they will be out of the picture anyway when ROLANDANDSEY takes over. ROGERS wonders whether he shouldn't go right to SPRUILLEGRADEN but HYLPERIN believes this might be questionable inasmuch as BRADEN may not stay with the State Department. ROGERS advises there is a hot rumor going around to the effect that BYRNES will leave the State Department and FRED VINSON will take over. ROGERS, in further discussing this problem, agreed he should try and get to LANGER. He related that at the conclusion of his interview EVANS spoke for the first time by advising that there were only two conclusions to be reached, one that ROGERS won't cooperate (by resigning) and two, that ROGERS is willing to face any charges which are brought against him.

THEODORE HALPERIN conferred with GALE RICHTER of Room 306, Senate Office Building, Extension 1102 and stated that ANGUS McDONALD suggested he contact her with reference to his employment problem. These individuals agreed to meet for lunch and talk the situation over.

Shortly subsequent to the above, BOB ROGERS contacted MAURICE HALPERIN, refering to him as "the sage". ROGERS advised he has been doing a lot of research work on the Costa Rican matter, which is a document he has been given to edit. HALPERIN inquired as to whether ROGERS camped on the doorstep of the "big boss" (WILLIAH LANGER), to which ROGERS replied in the affirmative and stated that "the doctor" (WOODROW BORAH) and I would like to come out for awhile. HALPERIN stated that he will be digging in his garden all day and it was finally agreed that BORAH and ROGERS would come out sometime in the morning of May 18th.

EDITA HALPERIN conferred with LILLIAN DUNATAY on May 17th, at which time she inquired as to whether Mrs. HALPERIN knows ALLAN ROSENBERG. Mrs. HALPERIN does not know MR. ROSENBERG, so Mrs. DUNATAY advised that her husband was going to Baltimore, Maryland with ROSENBERG and other men on the following day. Mrs. HALPERIN then advised that TOODROTEBORAH and BOB ROGERS are coming to her home at 11 AM, May 18th and help MAURICE HALPERIN work in the yard

THEODORE HALPERIN conferred with GALE RICHTER on May 18th. They discussed the possibility of HALPERIN's obtaining an introduction to VAN BITTNER through a friend, whereupon RICHTER suggested THEODORE see ELIZABETH SASULY who might be able to help him in obtaining a position. She said she would contact ELIZABETH SASULY and tell her about THEODORE. She inquired as to whether THEODORE had any luck with RUTHROELER.

Informant also a dvised on May 18th that EDITH HALPERIN informed LHLLIAN DUNKTAY she has just finished the speech which she will deliver at her

much as Mrs. HALPERIN is tired of the criticisms being directed at the Jewish children by the teachers (4)

JOSEPH GREGG conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN on May 18th at which time HALPERIN detailed the possibilities of his obtaining a professorship at the University of Maryland. In this connection, HALPERIN stated he did not want anyone around town to get ideas about this position as "there are people who would definitely like to see me not get any job, you understand." GREGG replied, "I understand."

HALPERIN further related he wants to get this position before any announcement of his employment is actually made. GREGG explained that he has several irons in the fire, one of which is "Newsletter". HALPERIN then referred to a friend of his named ANGUS McDONAID, who just walked into "U. S. News" and came out with a good job. GREGG replied, "Yeah, World Report".

Later in the day, BOB ROCERS contacted TERLY SOR.CCO, who was temporarily visiting LILLIN DUNGAY. ROCERS inquired as to whether SOR.CCO had gotten in touch with EVELYN ROSS whereupon she stated she planned to do so shortly. ROCERS advised he would rather see GROSS the following day.

Additional data developed on May 18th indicates that Mrs. HAPPERIN advised MAURICE HALPERIN that WARREN THORNTHWAITE is anxious to get in touch with him.

Shortly subsequent to the above, TAMEN THORNTHWAITE and MAURICE HALPERIN conferred. HALPERIN rehashed his University of Maryland prospects and advised he is having lunch with President BYED of the University on the following Tuesday. THORNTHWAITE advised he is leaving Mashington, D. C. Monday morning for his new position. He stated he has stored his library in the building and is on annual leave from the Department of Agriculture. THORNTHWAITE further related that his wife, DENZIL, and the children, will go to Michigan later on. He stated his new place of employment is 50 miles west of Atlantic City.

On May 19th MAURICE HAPPERIN contacted DAVID WAHL and inquired as to whether he should bring in the biographical sketches when he comes to town on Tuesday. TAHL advised he is going to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania over the weekend, partly on business and partly on personal matters.

DR. J. LANDAU, who was stopping in Room 330, Willard Hotel, informed MAURICE HALPERIN that he had just gotten into town. He invited HALPERIN to join him at breakfast on the following day. Subsequent to this, HALPERIN advised he would pick up DR. LANDAU that evening and take him to his home for the evening.

ALEXANDER LESSER conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN on May 19th at which time he inquired as to whether "they ever did write you for a statement". LESSER stated HALPERIN should write to ELDREDGE SIBLEY, whereupon HALPERIN stated he would do so. HALPERIN then related that SIBLEY had sent him a form to fill out concerning IRVING GOIDMAN. According to Informant, LESSER desires to return to academic work for a year to study anthropology and modern cultures. He explained to HALPERIN that he proposes to make a critical study of recent science and research on modern communities and cultures. He further proposes to prepare a report on these matters and to develop a research program. Due to this, LESSER intends to spend time in a University similar to Chicago University. He advised that he has been in touch with RUTH BENEDICT in this connection.

ARNOLD COURT, who is visiting at the home of MAURICE HALPERIN, confirmed a reservation which is being held for him at the Roger Smith Hotel.

EVELYN CROSS of the State Department, contacted MAURICE MAIPERIN on May 20th; MAIPERIN inquired if her husband, RAY, was going to school during the summer, to which she replied in the affirmative. She advised that she had been with BOB ROGERS and PERRY SORACCO the previous evening. CROSS also mentioned that HENRY MORGENTHAU, JR., sent in some information on Argentina. HALPERIN stated he wrote to the radio station to obtain a copy of the broadcast made by MORGENTHAU over WIMA on May 8th. The title of this broadcast was "Uruguay, Argentina's Victim No. 1".

HALPERIN mentioned he would like to talk with EVELYN CROSS about her experiences, stating, "you are really on the inside now, aren't you". Mrs. CROSS replied she would like to tell him all about her experiences as she knows he would be very interested.

MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with the secretary of DAVID LATRENCE of World Report" on May 20th. He advised this individual that he was formerly Chief of the Latin-American Division of the Office of Strategic Services, and would like to make an appointment to see Mr. LATRENCE about a position. HALPERIN was advised that he should talk to CLARE GALICTAY, the Executive Editor of "Torld Report" and an appointment was made for the following day.

Additional data supplied by informant on May 20, 1946 reveals that MAURICE HALPERIN contacted BOB ROGERS. ROGERS advised that there is a movement on to lower the efficiency ratings. He stated that WILLMOORE KENDILL is behind this and maintains HALPERIN was not too sick to sign WOODROW BORAH's rating. ROGERS then advised that he left the memorandum which he had prepared at the office of SHERMAN KENT. He stated that inasmuch as KENT was not in, he obtained a signed receipt for the memorandum.

On May 20, 1946, MAURICE HALE RIN again conferred with BOB POGFRS, who informed him that things are strategically horrible as a result of the trouble caused by WILLMOORE KENDALL. He also related he received some good advice from DAVID WAHL, concerning the stand he should take. ROGERS related that he suggested to WOODROW BORAH that he get the whole office to complain as it looks like the efficiency ratings will be revised from top to bottom.

EDITH HALPERIN conferred with an individual believed to be RUTH WILLIAMS on May 20, 1946. She inquired into the health of ERICATILIAMS and said that she had a friend from Oklahoma whose husband is starting to work on Wednesday at the War Department (ARNOID COURT). Mrs. HALPERIN went on to relate that MAURICE HALPERIN is working in his garden, whereas she is still teaching school. She stated that they plan to go to Boston, Massachusetts in June, inasmuch as her brother is getting married.

PHILIR DUNAWAY invited MAURICE HALPERIN to his home on May 21, 1946 to meet ROBERT LAMB and CARL GREEN, both of the CIO offices in Washington. Shortly subsequent to this, HALPERIN informed WOODROW BORAH that he would drop by his house at 8 PM. HALPERIN also made an engagement to see BOB ROGERS at 9 PM prior to going to the home of PHILIP DUNAWAY. HALPERIN inquired concerning the official title of Mr. REAM. He was advised that LOUIS M. REAM is the Administrator, Administrative Management of the American Red Cross.

Also on May 21, 1946, MAURICE HALPERIN confirmed a luncheon engagement with LOUIS QUINTINILLA and DR. BYRD of the University of Maryland.

HALPERIN conferred with CLARK GALLOWAY of "World Report" on May 21st. He advised he would like to talk to GALLOWAY regarding their Latin-American operations and the possibility that he might be useful to them in one way or another. HALPERIN related that he was a former chief of the Latin-American Division of O.S.S., which organization was transferred to the State Department. An appointment was made for 3 PM on instant date.

WOODROW BORAH contacted MAURICE HALPERIN on May 21st, at which time HALPERIN advised that he had an appointment to see ADOLPHO at 2:30 PM, which he would like to postpone.

On May 22nd, LCUIS REAM and MAURICE HALE RIN postponed their luncheon engagement until the following day.

The same day THEODORE HALPERIN conferred with ANGUS McDONALD of "World Report". He informed McDONALD that thanks to GALE RICHTER, he has a lead on a job which entailed research and legislative work.

Later that day, LILLIAN DUNAWAY informed Mrs. HALPERIN she and her husband are going to act as baby sitters for the DAVID WAHLS, inasmuch as they are attending a banquet on instant night (banquet of Southern Conference on Human Welfare).

On the same day BOB ROGERS attempted to reach DAVID WAHI, only to learn that he had left the office for an appointment with Mr. PAUL HITE of UNRRA

On May 23, 1946, MAURICE HALPERIN made a luncheon appointment with MIDREDGE SIBLEY for 11:15 AH. (1)

It was also ascertained that ALEXANDER LESSER conferred with MAURICE HALERIN on the same day. HALPERIN explained that he went to see ELDREDGE SIBLEY for the purpose of recommending LESSER for a job. According to Informant, LESSER is also interested in obtaining employment in connection with United Nations. LESSER told HALPERIN that WHILMOORE KENDALL confronted ROBERT RICHARDSON with EMPERIN to know about the trip HALPERIN took to Boston when he had an interview for position with the United Fruit Company. HALPERIN is not worried about KENDALL's checks. HALPERIN and LESSER agreed that ROLAND HUSSEY will take over the division in the near future. In this connection, LESSER advised that KENDALL is leaving on a vacation the first of June and there is some indication that HUSSEY's outfit will absorb A. R. I. around June 17th.

Also on May 23rd, PHILIP DUNATAY conferred with THEODORE HALPERIN. HALPERIN advised he is looking for a job in journalism and toward this end, has contacted RUSS NIXON, EUGENE COTTON, SETEMEVINE and LEADECAUX, as well as DECAUX, assistant, HENRY C. FLEISHER. THEODORE HALPERIN further related that FLEISHER sent him to see TRAVIS HEDRICK of Federated Press, and HELEN FULLER. PHILIDUNATAY mentioned IZZID STONE of "The Mation" and PM Newspaper. DUNATAY then related that CARL GREEN is still trying to get shold of BONDANB. HALPERIN stated he talked to NIXON and COTTON with reference to the Southern CIO drive and learned that there is not much chance for his gaining employment there. DUNATAY advised that a friend of his by the name of BRUCE MAYBUR is working for RUSS NIXON and that this individual previously worked in the Government under him. DUNATAY, and under BERNIE EERNSTEIN in Europe. WAYBUR is now with the Mashington office of the United Electrical Workers and, according to DUNATAY, is "a very nice fellow". HALPERIN informed that he still has his finger in on a possible job with the Food and Tobacco Workers (CIO). In this connection RUSS NIXON is going to put in a good word for HALPERIN with ELIZABETH SASULY. These individuals mentioned SELMAROSLIK (phonetic) who is now working in the United Electrical Workers National Office in New York.

DUNINGLY told HILPIN that PALMER IS the head of the P.A.C. in New York, his address being 205 East 42nd Street, New York City, telephone Murray Hill 3-5580. DUNAMAY describes this person as being an old friend of his, as well as CARL CREEN and BOB LAMB.

On May 24th BOB ROGERS contacted an individual by the name of JOSEPH BAULKIN (phonetic). This individual advised he has been working in the Library of Congress. These individuals engaged in a general social conversation.

Shortly subsequent to the above, BOB ROGERS conferred with ALLAN ROSENEE.G to inform him that he will pick ALLAN up for a 12:30 luncheon engagement.

ANNE SNODGRASS contected MAURICE HALPERIN on May 24th to invite the HALPERINS to dinner on Saturday or Sunday.

TENTY SOR: CCO contacted, BOB ROGERS, who was visiting the HILPERIN residence to advise him that SARMOSENBERG requested her to advise ROGERS that JOE BAULKIN is in town and anxious to reach him.

On May 25th LYNN/RYAN visited the home of MAURICE HALPERIN. HALPERIN and RYAN then went to visit the DUNAWAYS.

IRS. ARNOLD COURT conferred with EDITH HIPERIN on May 26th, at which time she informed that she found an apartment in the southeast section of the city.

Also on May 26th, BOB ROGERS advised MAURICE HALPERIN the whole crowd is gathering at the home of DAVID WAHL around 3 PM today.

MAURICE HALPERIN engaged in a conversation with ARREN THORNTH AITE on May 26, 1946, at which time HALPERIN made the remark that although President BYRD of the University of Maryland is stalling, he apparently is favorable towards HALPERIN's plan for a Latin-American Division in the school. HALPERIN also mentioned the possibility of obtaining a job with a Jewish organization in New York City, which will have something to do with the United Nations, the principal task involved being liaison work with this organization.

BETTY AVERY conferred with THEODORE HILPERIN on May 27th and invited him to attend the meeting of the Southern Conference on Human Welfare. She described this group as one which could be supported, stating the meeting is being sponsored by the Washington Council for Negroes, and the National Negro Congress; they agreed to attend.

DAVID WAHL conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN on May 27th, at which time HALPERIN stated he might go to New York City and see the members of the Jewish organization (possibly the United Jewish Congress) rather than wait for the letter of invitation. In this connection HALPERIN advised he could see his literary agent, GEORGE SYE, and also cover the other deal.

Additional information developed by Informant on May 27th indicates that BOB RCIRS informed MAURICE HALPERIN that he has been assigned a special job by WILLIAM LANGER. He said this job will entail a complete report of the Bureau Americanus Institute. In this connection, ROGERS will be under the supervision of Colonel GEORGE FEARING of O. C. D. ROGERS described FEARING as being an old friend of his, who was in the Air Corps Intelligence in Europe during the war. ROGERS added that WILLHOORE KENDALL will be fired on June 7th due to the fact that he is in a technical position wherein his veteran's tenure does not apply.

Also on May 27th, CARL GREEN contacted MAURICE HALPERIN to inquire whether THEODORE HALPERIN had seen RUSS NIXON of the United Electrical Workers. GREEN mentioned that HALPERIN should submit a synopsis of his background to MAYNARD GERTLER (War Department). It was finally agreed that CARL GREEN would bring the GERTLERS to HALPERIN's home later in the day.

TOODROW BORGH conferred with HILPERIN on May 27th, at which time he stated that TILLMOORE KENDALL maintains that SHERMAN KENT is determined to lower BOB ROGERS efficiency rating.

Subsequent to the above, HALPERIN contacted DAVID WAHL, and told him about CARL GREEN wanting to bring MAYNARD GERTLER and his wife out to his home on instant evening. WAHL described GERTLER as a every nice boy".

It was also determined from Informant on May 27th that MARY JANE KEENEY contacted EDITH HAIPERIN for the purpose of ascertaining how she could reach Mrs. ARNOID COURT. According to Informant, MARY JANE KEENEY is willing to allow the COURTS to use her furniture while she is absent from the city. KEENEY stated she could be reached at Franklin 0592 until 9:30 PM on instant night. This phone is listed to I. H. BLEIBERG, 567 Lebaum Street, S. E. Jane 19:30 PM on instant night.

Addition to the above, Informant states EDITH HALPERIN contacted JENNIE.

TILER on the same day, at which time she advised that THEODORE HALPERIN may go to work for the CIO. She also stated that the HALPERIN family will go to Boston on June 20th for the purpose of attending her brother MILTON'S wedding. Mrs. MILLER informed that WOODROW BORAH told her husband, ROBERT T. MILLER, that Boston University is not accepting Jewish students. Mrs. HALPERIN does not believe this is true inasmuch as her 18 year old brother is attending Medical School there. Mrs. HALPERIN also advised that ROSE GREGO may not go to Canada after all. She mentioned the possibility of MAURICE HALPERIN obtaining a job with a Jewish organization in New York City. Mrs. MILLER stated she met Mr. and Mrs. DAVID WAHL at the Southern Conference of Human Welfare dinner about a week ago. EDITH HALPERIN saw FIO LEVY at a Shakespearian play and Mrs. MILLER mentioned that FLO LEVY is going to spend two weeks at Capon Springs. (M)

It was also learned on May 27th that MAURICE HALPERIN informed DAVID TAHL that his friends, CARL GREEN, MAYNARD GURTLER and MRS. GERTLER had arrived.

It was agreed that TAHL and PHILIP DUNATAY will be over shortly.

On May 28th, THEODORE HALPERIN attempted to confer with ELIZABETH STAULY.
LOUIS REAM also attempted to contact MAURICE HALPERIN.

On the same day EDITH HALPERIN informed Mrs. CORRINE COURT (MRS. ARNOLD COURT) that a friend of here, namely MARY JANE KEENEY, 2215 B Street, N. F., is going to Japan and has some furniture she would like to loan somebody if they would

pay for the transportation. She stated she told MARY JANE about the COURTS and MRS. KEENEY is now anxious to have the COURTS get in touch with her-

EDITH HALPERIN and DENZIN THORNTH AITE engaged in a conversation on May 28th relative to HALPERIN's prospective job with a Jewish organization in New York City. In this connection, his. HALPERIN advised that the organization wants a sphere of friendliness with the United Nations people, inasmuch as there has been an incline of anti-Semitism in South America. She explained that a friend of theirs, namely DAVID AHL, is in charge of the Washington office and formerly suggested to the organization that they obtain the services of a Latin-American man. The organization is very pleased with HALPERIN's qualifications.

Later in the day, TERRY SORACCO and EDITH HALPERIN discussed various matters, and in particular the fact that NAURICE HALPERIN and BOB ROGERS are sharing a room at the Lexington Hotel in New York City. SONACCO advised that she is presently entertaining EVELYN CROSS and then related that WHILPOOPE KENDALL is leaving the office on the following day and possibly will not return.

Mrs. HALPERIN said she met MANNARD GERTLER and his wife on the previous evening and was very favorably impressed by them.

According to Informant, EDITH WIPERIN contacted WOODRO! BORAH on May 28, at which time they discussed the fact that WHILMOORE KENDAIL will no longer be in BORAH's division at the State Department. BORAH explained that he has been to see SHERMAN KENT whom he informed he will not reduce any of the efficiency ratings. BORAH went on to explain that ROLAND HUSSEY is setting up an entirely new organization and DONALD in DOZER will be his deputy. BORAH does not know whether or not his services will be retained, stating that while he is on good terms with HUSSEY, he believes HUSSEY will not incur anyone's displeasure by keeping BORAH around. BORAH described HUSSEY as being completely identified with the dominant groups.

THEODORE HAIPERIN contacted ELIZABETH SASULY on May 29th to inquire as to whether the job he had talked to her about has developed. SASULY advised that the people have not come into town, but when they did arrive she would take the matter up with them. She described the position as being one which entailed supervision by several unions. HALPERIN feels a little frustrated on not being able to pitch in and do something about "things". HALPERIN remarked that the papers seem to indicate the opposition is gaining strength. He added that it is much better than last week so it is just the question of putting the pressure on.

Shortly subsequent to the above, THEODORE HILPERIN attempted to reach DON POND (phonetic) at Woodley 2485.

Also on the 29th, THEODORE HALPERIN contacted BETTY AVERY, of EUGENE COTTON'S office. THEODORE invited her to go to the movies and it was agreed that they

will meet in front of the Little Theater. AVERY then mentioned that "the House has passed the Senate version of the Case Bill". HALPERIN replied, "Thy the dirty b-s".

SARAH DAVOLA (phonetic) of the Anti-Poll Tax Committee, conferred with THEODORE HALPERIN. She informed him that she heard of a job today which is temporary but might evolve into a perminent position. She suggested that HALPERIN go down to the offices of the Win the Peace Conference. In this connection she advised that the national organization is having a big affair and needs someone to help on publicity. HALPERIN was referred to ABBOTT SIMON, 1309 14th St., N. J., telephone Michigan 8839.

THEODORE HALPERIN conferred with PHILIP DUNAMAY on May 29th for the purpose of advising him that ERUCE WAYBUR was unable to assist him in obtaining a position with the United Electrical Workers. HALPERIN inquired as to whether DUNAWAY knows anything about the "Win the Peace Conference". DUNAWAY not being able to supply much information, suggested HALPERIN call DAVID WAHL

Subsequent to the above, MAURICE HALPERIN advised his wife, EDITH, that he can have the job with the Jewish organization in New York City if he wants:

On May 30, 1946, MAURICE HALPERIN attempted to contact HENRIETT ALOTZ of Murray Hill 5-5362 in New York City. As Mrs. KLOTZ was not around, HALPERIN conferred with HENRY MORGENTHAU. HALPERIN inquired whether GEORGE BYE had mentioned him to MORGENTHAU. MORGENTHAU stated that he had, and it was agreed that HALPERIN would visit him at 3 PM the following Wednesday at 285 Madison Avenue, the 22nd floor. HALPERIN mentioned he was impressed by MORGENTHAU's talk on Uruguay, whereupon MORGENTHAU made the statement that HALPERIN sounded like a "new dealer".

On May 30th, MAURICE HALPERIN advised BOB ROGERS that he has to go to New York City again for two reasons. He stated he has an appointment with HENRY MORGENTHAU and on the following day he again will meet with the Jewish organization. HALPERIN also advised, "So, I think we're in business with MORGENTHAU". ROGERS replied, "So, you have to get his (MORGENTHAU) assent and make a very short description . . BYE (GEORGE HYE) peddles it . . . My God!" HALPERIN related that is is such a cinch it will necessitate the setting up of a partnership to get the work done. HALPERIN thinks TOODROW BORAH will do the work, where-upon ROGERS stated, "He stays right where he is to do it (State Department)". ROGERS maintained that the MORGENTHAU deal is a very valuable contact in all directions. If HALPERIN obtains the Jewish position he will probably move to New York City.

Also on May 30th, TOODROW BORAH conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN, At this time MAURICE HALPERIN advised he talked to the Executive Committee of the Jewish organization and they are all for hiring him. He explained that his duties



will entail liaison work with the United Nations and further stated the organization represents a number of Jewish groups. Insofar as HALPERIN is concerned it will be like working in OSS all over again. He added that they gave him a very interesting security check in which all the weaknesses of other security checks became points in his favor. It really amounted to nothing more than a question as to where his, HALPERIN's, people were born. HALPERIN stated he enjoyed this check immensely and he might say it is the first time a security check was actually enjoyable. HALPERIN also related that this organization talks in terms of raising a million dollars for an honest-to-goodness research staff. BORAH believes HALPERIN will be crossing swords with people who are as smart as he is, for the first time. H.LPERIN condescendingly admits some may be smarter than he is and states that a good many of them have been in the business since 1900. He also maintains these individuals can illustrate everything by citing incidents which occurred in their conference in Copenhagen in 1915. He also mentioned that all of the member organizations will offer jurisdictional difficulties. H/LFERIN is going back up to New York next week and talk to "one of Mr. ROUSEVELT's right hand men" (HENRY MORGENTHAU, JR.). HILPERIN suggested that BORGH might be interested in some of the jobs that have been offered so far. BORAH replied, Well I have a little fight to settle before I go anywhere". (refers to State Department) BORAH then asked if HALPERIN is going to see "our new Chief" to which HALPERIN replied in the affirmative. BORAH stated "he" (ROLAND HUSSEY) has been unfolding his plans to ISABERATENNIE (RENNIE apparently passes the information on to BORAH). According to RENNIE the new deputy chief under HUSSEY will be DONALD W. HOZER. choice is considered very satisfactory by both BORAH and HALPERIN. The organization will be divided into four sections, three geographic and one functional section. It is indicated that HUSSEY will use his present staff and fill in with personnel from A. R. I.-

BOWAH says HUSSEY is very cordial towards him but he believes pressure has been exerted to squeeze him, BORAH, out. BOWAH also advised that he can present SHERMAN KENT with "a carbon copy and ask him to comment on it". HALFERIN advised BOWAH to sit tight and see what develops. BOWAH maintains he would like to be relieved of all administrative duties and move over into the new division with a reduction in status and rank. HALFERIN believes this would be o.k. as BOWAH would go over in the top of the grade. BOWAH newver, wants a formal assurance that SHERMAN KENT was mistaken (about BOWAH resigning for the good of the service). He wants a hearing in which a formal opinion will be rendered. He advises that in this connection he consulted a lawyor and learned that private opinions would not be worth a thing insofar as protection is concerned. HALPERIN will work with BOWAH on this but believes any action should be carefully considered on a basis of relationship of all factors possibly involved.

On May 30th, WILLIAM MPPLEBAUM advised MAURICE HALPERIN that he and his wife would visit the HALPERINS at 8:30 PM the following day

On May 31st, MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with LILLIAN and PHILIP DINATAY. He mentioned the fact that WILLIAM APPLEBAUM was in town and invited the DUNAWAY'S to his home. He stated that BOB ROCERS and WODROW BORAH will also be present. HALPERIN then indicated that his job in New York City is practically "in the bag" and they are quite willing to meet his present salary. HALPERIN mentioned the possibilities of switching places with DAVID WAHL so that WAHL would take over the job in New York City and HALPERIN would step into WAHL's office here in Washington.

Leter in the day, M.URICE HALPERIN made a luncheon engagement with RCLAND HUSSEY of the State Department to take place at 1 PM on Monday at the Cosmos Club. HALPERIN mentioned he will pay a courtesy call on WILLIAM LANGER prior to this luncheon.

During the course of a social conversation between DENZIL THERTHMITE and EDITH HILPERIN on May 31st, Mrs. HILPERIN mentioned that the RUBERT T. MILLERS were at her home on the previous evening.

On the same day EDITH HALPERIN engaged in a social conversation with JENNIE MILLER, wife of ROBERT T. MILLER. It was ascertained at this time that DAVID HALPERIN, son of MAURICE HALPERIN, will spend the night at the MILLER home.

Also on May 31st, BETTY AVERY of the CIC Headquarters, left word for THEOD RE HALPERIN to get in touch with her. In view of this, THEODORE HALPERIN contacted BETTY AVERY, at which time she advised she has volunteered to work for HARRIED BOUSIOG and SETH LEVINE (CIO Maritime Committee) on the following day. She stated she will assist in getting out press releases, etc., inasmuch as they did not desire to hire a public stenographer for the job. THEODORE mentioned he will start to work for the "Win the Peace Conference" the following day as they are frantically preparing for the Watcrgate meeting. HALPERIN mentioned that it will be a lot of work but it is "for the right cause".

The following information was obtained by confidential informant during the period indicated. 127 D

On May 21, 1946, it was ascertained HELEN NICHOL, an employee of the State Department in Dr. BRUNNAUER's office, contacted Mrs. ALGED FISS to advise that several women in the State Department were giving a Auncheon for a Mrs. HIXLEY who is arriving in Washington with her husband. The luncheon was to be held at the Parrot Tearoom at 1 p.m., on the following Monday.

On May 22, 1946, an individual known to the informant as BARBARA RADIUS contacted PRISCILLA HISS to advise she was postponing the party that was scheduled for Saturday, and that it would be held a week subsequent to that time, May 31, 1946. BARBARA advised her husband WALTER had not yet returned from Paris but was leaying soon by Air Transport. (The Congressional directory lists a WALTER A KRADIUS as adviser, Office of Transportation and Communications Policy, State Department, 3330 Newark Street. A check of the dity directory indicates BARBARA EXRADIUS is the wife of WALTER A. RADIUS.)

On Kay 23, 1946, PRISCHIA HISS was contacted by an unidentified woman at which time the two discussed family matters, the woman's recent trip, and a person by the name of ALLEM STEYNE. Appearently some sort of scandal was involved in their discussion although the parties involved in it were not made clear to the informant.

On the same date it was ascertained ALGER HISS was remaining at his home and he was planning to go to the funeral for the mother-in-law of STANIEY , HANBECK (phonetic).

On this date HISS was in contact with JACK ROSS of the State Department at which time they discussed State Department affairs. ROSS indi-

7 show bor cated he had a long talk with DON and JACK THOMPSON "about getting this atomic energy man. The conversation was largely concerned with plans for a coordinating center as relates to atomic energy. HISS at this time indicated there were some papers on his desk relating to the atomic energy matter as well as a draft of a speech for BARUCH.

On the same date HISS was contacted by JOHN LEIAND (phonetic) at which time LEIAND indicated he had lunched with HARDING BANCROFT and had discussed some of the proceedings with BANCROFT. LELAND also indicated he had been at the Iranian Embassy. HISS stated he had been sick with the flu and could not join LEIAND that evening to discuss matters. LEIAND indicated he planned to see BEN COHEN the following day to discuss matters further. HISS indicated he thought it would be a good thing for LOW HENDERSON to be in on the conference with COHEN the next day. The discussion further centered about the Iranian situation and the possibility that Ala might be recalled. Both agreed the situation was getting progressively worse and progressively deteriorating.

On the same date a person known to informant as JACK SUTHERAND (phonetic) contacted ALGER HISS stating he had been referred to HISS by BASIL LOWE (phonetic) about a year ago. SUTHERAND indicated he is trying to get a young lady out of France and wonders if HISS could exert some influence to assist him in the matter of a visa.

On May 24, 1946, it was ascertained HISS was ill and still planning not to come into his office. He contacted his office to suggest that JACK ROSS attend the 4 o'clock staff meeting in his place, and that certain matters be taken up with the Protocol Division of the State Department.

On the same date a person known to informant as CLEST KORSE (phonetic) contacted ALGER HISS, and it was indicated the parties had not seen each other in a long time. MORSE advised he was in the office of S. W. MAR-SHALL in the Shoreham Building, and this was a consulting engineers office, main headquarters in Dallas, Texas. Discussion also brought up the question of attendance at the Baltimore City College alumni settogether on June 3, 1946. Both of them referred to the college as "that hell hole." MORSE indicated he commutes from Baltimore every day but hoped to be able to meet with HISS for lunch some day soon.

On the same date HISS contacted his office and discussed various matters concerning State Department affairs. He indicated his illness was continuing, and he expected to be in on Monday, May 27, 1946. In conversation with JACK ROSS, it was ascertained ROSS had made certain arrangements to get STEIN and his assistant to New York and was planning tentatively on going there sometime Monday himself with IKE (last name not given). They further discussed personnel and matters which appeared to relate primarily

to State Department concerns. In the course of the discussion they referred to SOKOLOFF and his reaction to the atomic energy business. It was indicated from the history of treatment by the military staff committee they were uncertain as to just how much the atomic energy commission would want the secretariat to do. ROSS indicated he could see no reason for getting worried over the supply and demand problem although they should keep it on their calendar for consideration. HISS indicated he had discussed the matter with EASTON, and his idea of getting "an atomic energy man." They indicated a person by the name of HOWARD COHNSTON might serve as an assistant in Tashington but that might raise some difficulty on the personnel level.

HISS stated he felt they were well organized to take care of the BARUCH "procedural needs," but that he felt this still did not give them "any break into the substance; it doesn't use the procedure as a means of breaking into substance." HISS stated he felt it was necessary to get somebody who knows something about atomic energy subsidy question as a part of the general disarmament picture.

In the course of the discussion, HISS indicated HORNING BACKBROKE (phonetic) had mentioned to him over the telephone a chap by the name of BYROM-HILLER who might fit in now. ROSS agreed that he might be worth considering because he has had a good bit of contact with the atomic energy work already.

On May 25, 1946, a person known to informant as MUNROE SMITH of Northfield, Massachusetts, contacted ALCER HISS advising he is from American Youth Hospital. SMITH advised he had talked with Mr. BRICKEL (phonetic) after his discussion with HISS a few months ago and "BRICKEL had asked SMITH to send him a copy of the photostat letter from the office in Holland and Frieburg." HISS indicated he was not sure he was aware of what SMITH was speaking. SMITH indicated he believed he had spoken with HISS at the Hague. HISS then indicated he believed SMITH wanted to contact his cousin FRILIP HISS who was stationed at the Hague as the OMI representative, and he now lives at New Canaan, Connecticut.

On May 26, 1946, a person known to informant as PORTER contacted ALCER HISS advising he thought HISS should check up on the story by SCOTTY RASSMUSSEN in the New York Times for May 26, 1946. PORTER advised the AP, UP, and all the other news boys had been chasing him about the story. HISS advised "he couldn't have been righter had he been inside the department, but I don't see that that means we can say anything to the other people and I don't know where he got it." HISS stated there had been a telegram prepared to send out to Teheran. He further stated, "This is the issue as it has been posed now—well, ever since we thought about the investigating possibility. Up until then there seemed only one alternative, to drop it." He advised a telegram had been sent to ŒORGE ALLEM but he does not know whether there has been any reply yet.

Conversation dealt at length with matters of a State Department nature and fragmentary information obtained by informant did not permit identification of all matters discussed. In the course of the discussion they referred to a Moscow radio statement as it affects instructions that were probably given to ALA and its bearing upon the inquiry into certain matters. Conversation appeared to refer to the Russian occupation of Iran and investigation into the reported withdrawal of Russian troops.

On the same date, a person known to informant as <u>LOY HENDERSON</u> contacted HISS advising he was at his office. The two men discussed matters which appeared to relate to the security council and State Department policy matters. They referred to action being taken by the British, as well as unidentified resolutions which had been sent to various governments. The discussion appeared to revolve about the Iranian dispute in which the Russian troops' withdrawal is a matter of issue.

On May 27, 1946, CATHERINE HISS contacted PRISCILLA HISS and discussed family matters at which time PRISCILLA indicated ALGER HISS is not certain about his vacation but wants to go to LIB's wedding on June 30, 1946, and after that go up to Vermont.

On the same date HELEN MICHOL of the State Department contacted PRISCILIA HISS to advise Mrs. BRUNNAUER had scheduled the dinner for May 28, 1946, at 7:30 p.m. in the Parrot Restaurant.

On May 28, 1946, an unidentified person known to informant as BEN (possibly BEN/STRAUSS) contacted PRISCILLA HISS advising he arrived in the city on May 27, 1946, about 4 p.m., and that MARGO was on a train coming from Chicago. He was invited to dinner at the HISS home that evening and accepted.

On the same date an unidentified person known to informant as HENRY contacted PRISCILIA HISS and advised he was "going back this afternoon." Subsequently this individual was referred to in conversation as BEN. Informant was unable to ascertain the identity of this person from the personal conversation between the parties.

On the same date a woman by the name of HENRIETTA MOORE (wife of a Captain MOORE of the U. S. Navy) contacted PRISCILIA HISS and discussed renting summer places. She indicated she spends her summers at ROBERT LEISH-MAN's place near Chain Bridge. Mrs. HISS advised DOROTHY WOOD is a close friend of hers and might be of some assistance in solving the rent problem. Mrs. HISS further indicated she wants HENRIETTA and LAMONT to come to her house for supper sometime soon.

On May 29, 1946, Mrs. HISS contacted the State Department to advise ALGER HISS was still quite ill and would not be at the office on this date. Subsequently, Mrs. HISS made arrangements for ALGER HISS to go to the office of Dr. TRIBLE (phonetic) apparently in some relation to ALGER HISS's illness.

The following information was furnished by during the period May 16-31, 1946.

On May 16, 1946, DOROTHY KAPIAN contacted Mrs. SARAH SILVERMAN, wife of A. GEORGE SILVERMAN, also a subject in this case, at which time Mrs. KAPIAN advised she had returned from her vacation trip on Sunday (May 12, 1946) but she had gone to Baltimore on Monday, and this was her first day at home. The women discussed plans for visiting each other but decided to make arrangements at a later date.

On the same date it was ascertained Mrs. KAPIAN contacted a woman believed to be FRANCES FUCHS and they agreed to meet on the following Saturday at the FUCHS home.

On May 17, 1946, it was ascertained by informant that Mrs. MAPIAN contacted the Maritime Payroll Department and inquired concerning her Employees' Earning Statement. It was indicated at this time Mrs. MAPIAN is on leave without pay status.

On May 19, 1946, PEGGI NIERENBERG contacted the KAPIANS and invited them to dinner on Friday (May 24). The KAPIANS accepted the invitation. At this time the address of the NIERENBERGS was indicated as 2529 14th Street, S. E.

On May 22, 1946, it was ascertained the KAPLANE fere in contact with a woman known to the informant only as BEA (possibly BEANORMAN, DOROTHY KAPLAN's sister). It was ascertained a relative of the KAPLANS was quite ill in a Baltimore hospital, and plans were discussed for the KAPLANS visiting in Baltimore.

On the same date DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted BEADIF WAN TASSEL and advised they considered postponing the picnic which they had planned for Sunday (May 26).

On May 23, 1946, RUTH/KWELLER, whose residence was indicated as Baltimore, contacted DOROTHY KAPIAN and requested DOROTHY to secure reservations on American, TWA or United Airlines on June 1, 1946, for two seats to Los Angeles, California.

On May 23, 1946, it was ascertained ELVER NORMAN contacted DOROTHY KAPLAN to advise that "Dad has taken a turn for the worse," and he was not expected to live very long. Subsequently, it was ascertained that DOROTHY KAPLAN made arrangements to leave Washington to drive to Baltimore with IRVING KAPLAN in order that they might visit with DOROTHY KAPLAN's father at the hospital.

DOROTHY KAPIAN contacted REBEKAH FITZGERALD on this date and advised she would not be able to visit the FITZGERALDS that evening as they planned driving to Baltimore.

On May 28, 1946, it was ascertained the KAPLANS were checking with the airlines in Washington concerning reservations for Mr. and Mrs. KVELLER to Los Angeles.

On this date it was also ascertained that SAM (probably NORMAN) in the hospital at Baltimore had improved and was resting well.

On May 30, 1946, it was ascertained DOROTHY KAPLAN made reservations for June 6, 1946, at 5 p.m. with United Airlines for Mr. and Mrs. KWELLER.

On May 31, 1946, EDWARD FITZGERALD contacted DOROTHY KAPLAN and invited the KAPLANS to his home on that date or the day following. Mrs. KAPLAN requested that the invitation be kept open and she subsequently contacted FITZ-GERALD advising it would be impossible but they did hope to see the FITZGERALDS on Sunday following.

On the same date DOROTHY KAPIAN attempted without success to contact Mrs. SARAH SILVERMAN, wife of A. GEORGE SILVERMAN. It was later ascertained the KAPIANS had an engagement for June 1, 1946, at the home of BEADIE (possibly VAN TASSEL), and they expected to see people at that time by the name of STONE and enother family by the name of SPELLEAN.

advised on May 23, 1946, that S. GABLOOMFIELD, 2131 Valejo Street, San Francisco, California, corresponded with MIRY JINE KEENEY and among other things advised the following pertinent information:

HARRIET/EDDY's Telephone Number is Palo alto 2-5386; PELEBET's Telephone is Underhill 5-456; BERT's Office Telephone is Glencourt 7512, Dakland, California. BLOOMFIELD also said that the SERBERS did not have a listed telephone. It was also indicated in this correspondence that LARY JANE KEENEY may soon visit in San Francisco, California, as it was noted by Informant. stated he was awaiting her arrival in San Francisco.

SAMUEL GEORGE BLOOMFIELD

A review of the indices of the Washington Field Division reflected an Internal Security - R file entitled, "S.IUEL GEORGE BLOOMFIELD, was.", San Francisco, origin. This individual was also investigated by the Bureau in 1912 as an applicant for a position with the Office of the Coordinator of Information and it is believed he is identical with S. G. BLOONFIELD, correspondent of MARY JAME KEENEY.

BIOO:FIELD was born September 8, 1892 in Russia and received his American citizenship through the naturalization of his father on September 20, 1910. at Dover, New Hampshire. He entered the U. S. Government Service, November 7, 1935, as an area Supervisor for the U.S. Public Health Service and was employed by the W. P. A. from 1938 to 1938 and the Library of Congress, Washington, D. C., from 1939 to 1941. He is known to have had Communistic tendencies since 1935 and the Dies Committee indices reflect that BLOOMFIELD was a member of the HARLAN ANDERSON Citizens' Committee, the American League for Peace and

Democracy and the Washington Book Shop, all in Washington, D. C. His name appeared in the Daily Worker newspaper as the translator for the publication in England of a Russian brochure entitled, "BALZAC, A Marxist analyst". BLOOM-FIELD was also reported by informants of the Washington Field Division as being a contact of MARTIN CHAUCEY, City Secretary of the Communist Party of the District of Columbia in 1942.

D. C., by the Division of Special Information (Office of Strategic Services) as a Research Assistant, he was interviewed under the provisions of the Hatch Act. At this time he admitted membership in the Washington Book Shop and also membership on the Board of Trustees of the Washington Book Shop, Washington, D. C. He also admitted having attended a meeting of the American League for Peace and Democracy but denied membership.

On October 30, 1942, HLOOMFIELD terminated his employment with the federal government by resignation and moved to San Francisco, California. Investigation there reflected that he was in contact with the TOLLOOMEY Labor School, allegedly controlled by the Communist Party. He also was believed to be active in the American-Russian Institute in collaboration with LOUISE BRINSTEN, a prominent communist in San Francisco. BLOOMFIELD is known to have visited at the home of LOUISE BRINSTEN on February 6, 1945, and to have given a check on his personal bank account to American-Russian Relief for \$30.00 on January 30, 1945. As of April 23, 1945, BLOOMFIELD was employed as an Information Officer for the British Information Services, San Francisco, California.

DR. HILTON LEOF

Concerning Dr. MILTON LEDF, 322 South 16th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who corresponded with MARY J.NE KEENEY on May 18, 1946, a review of the indices of the Mashington Field Division reflected that DR. MILTON LEOF was the subject of an Internal Security - C investigation in Philadelphia during 1943. At that time he was reliably reported by informants of the Philadelphia Field Division to be a communist and to be a member of the Communist Party Unit of Doctors and Dentists in Philadelphia. His father, MORRIS V. LEOF, M.D., has headed many communist front organizations and his sister, MADELIN BLITZSTEIN, nee, LEOF, was in 1943, Secretary of the Russian War Relief and a suspected communist. DR. MILTON LEOF was last reported to be a practicing dentist in Philadelphia and was reported to have been a member of the Fedical Unit of the Spanish Brigade during the Spanish Civil War.

Reference is made to Captain HERMAN ZAP, 0-579750, care of American Embassy, Paris, APO 889, who corresponded with MARY JANE KEENEY on May 7, 1946.

The report of Special Agent LABERT G. ZANDER dated March 28, 1946, wo of instant case, reflects that Informant advised that WILLIAN. L. ULLIAN, subject of instant case, while a member of the U.S. Army Air Corps contacted Captain ZAP overseas and stated that ZAP had been most helpful to him (ULLMAN).

Treview of the indices of the Washington Field Division reflected that a Hatch act investigation was conducted in 1942 concerning EDITH SCHREIBER ZAP, wife of Captain HERMAN ZAP, ASN 0-579750. The investigation was instituted upon the allegation that EDITH ZAP had strong communistic sympathies but the investigation of her in Washington, D. C., failed to reflect any association with any un-American organizations. It was noted that EDITH TAP was born at Rymnow, Poland, April 5, 1919, and she was naturalized through her father in 1927.

Captain HERMAN ZAP was born May 2, 1911, in New York City, of Russian-born parents. He received a B. S. degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1934 and a M. A. degree from Columbia University in 1937. He was appointed a Second Lieutenant in the U. S. Army on April 16, 1943, and received his Captaincy April 26, 1945. At one time he was reported to be stationed at the Headquarters Office of the Military Government in Germany.

HARRIET GERTRUDI EDDY

Among the correspondents of HARY JANE KEENEY was HARRIET GERTRUDE EDDY, 86 Creek Drive, Menlo Park, California. The San Francisco Field Division was requested to establish the identity of this individual and to furnish all available backgrount information. By letter dated Hay 27, 1946, the San Francisco Field Division furnished the following:


MHARRIET GERTRUDE EDDY resides at 868 Creek Drive, Menlo Park, California, and the San Francisco Office has conducted an investigation of her in the file captioned HARRIET GERTRUDE EDDY, INTERNAL SECURITY - R, San Francisco File 100-667. A comprehensive statement of her background is contained in the summary report prepared in the Comintern Apparatus case by Special Agent MICHAEL JOSEPH CASSIDY dated at San Francisco, December 15, 1944, and will be found on pages 506 to 508 of the summary. For your convenience, the portion of the summary report pertaining to EDDY is set forth below:

EDDY was formerly Assistant Professor of Agriculture, Extension Division, University of California, Berkeley, California, and is now retired. She resides with her sister, Mrs. RALPH NEWLAN. She is an American citizen born of Canadian parents at Lexington, Michigan, February 19, 1876. She was educated in the United States, Gernany, Switzerland, and France, following which she was employed as a school teacher and instructor in this country. In 1926 she spent ten months traveling in Russia studying the library system there. She returned to Russia in 1930 with a Russian woman who had been sent to this country to study the library system here. Upon her return to America, she became associated with the University of California, Department of Agriculture, and remained there until her retirement.

Miss EDDY is a known Communist. She has been associated with the American Council for Soviet Relations, American-Russian Institute, Council of American-Soviet Friendship, Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, Russian-American Society, Russian War Relief, Medical Bureau of American Friends of Spanish Democracy, American Students' Union and Inter-Professional Society and Western Consumers' Union.

Since 1942, Miss EDDY has been in correspondence with JUAN/VICENS,
Vera Cruz 56 and Paris 7, Mexico City, D. F. In these letters they discuss
Russian war Relief and plans to raise funds for Spanish refugees. EDDY contributed funds to VICENS and the letter sent her various propaganda publications which she in turn has distributed in this country. The letters indicate that VICENS is employed in the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City and that various acquaintances of his have visited with EDDY at various times in San Francisco.

It is known that HELEN FARBMAN made mention of Miss EDDY in a letter to Senor JOSE MANTEGON, Vera Cruz 56, Mexico City, D. F., in which letter reference is made to the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. Miss EDDY has also been in correspondence with Senoritas ROSA MARLY ADRIANA and MERCELLA LOMBARDO OTERO, the daughters of VICENTE LOMBARDO TOISDAND; ANNA KRAVCHENKO, in Moscow; V. M. REMINA, Moscow, Russia, and an unidentified correspondent known as "E.C.C.", Tucuman 844, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Her correspondence is significant as the addresses of some of the persons she writes to are known to be mail drops for Communist communications and propaganda and strongly indicates the possibility Miss EDDY is acting as a mail drop in the United States for Communist propaganda material."

Confidential Informant advised that on May 12, 1946, MARY JANE KEENEY contacted HELEN SILVERHASTER, at which time MARY JANE stated that she had visited in New York the week before, having driven there with two friends of the American Red Cross. MARY JANE KEENEY requested HELEN SILVERHASTER to advise TILLIM LOULINAN that she had received a letter from HERMAN ZAP who was in Paris at the time he corresponded with her but expected to return to Germany soon. HELEN SILVERHASTER asked MARY JANE KEENEY how her "prospective trip" was coming and MARY JANE said that it was "hanging fire".

Confidential Informant also advised that on May 25, 1946, MARY JANE KEZNEY contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and stated that she was unable to visit with the SILVERMASTERS that weekend. MARYJANE KEENEY also advised her that she might go out of town soon and that it was contingent on getting approval from Japan. It is to be noted that MARY JANE KEENEY's husband, PHILIP C. KEENEY, is presently working for the War Department in Tokyo, Japan.

Numerous spot-check surveillances have been maintained on MARY JANE KEENEY during the period of this report and it has been determined that she has no regular hours of employment at the Department of State. She occasionally visits the Department of State and she has been observed to visit offices of the Department of State located on Connecticut and L Street, N. Washington, D. C.

URSULA WASSERMAN

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated May 2, 1946, transmitting to the Mashington Field Division a list of names and identifying information contained in the address book of URSULA MASSERMAN. The address book was in MASSERMAN'S possession at the time she departed from the United States for Buenos Mires Augentina, on March 1, 1946





The report of Special agent JOHN aTKINSON dated august 19, 1941, at Little Rock, arkansas, entitled TOMEONTEALTH COLLEGE - INTERNAL SECURITY, reflects that that institution was investigation by the arkansas State Legislature in 1939 and 1940 for failure to display the American flag and displaying an illegal emblem, that of the hammer and sickle. BERNARD BERNSTEIN's name appeared in the files of this institution as having been a visitor at the college.





A review of the indices of the Washington Field Division reflected that SOL RABKIN was a subject of a Hatch Act investigation in 1942. The report of Special Agent M. A. TAYLOR entitled, "SOL RABKIN, SPECIAL INSPECTOR, SENIOR SFECIAL INSFECTION DIVISION, IMPIGRATION AND NATURALIZATION SERVICE. U. S. DEFARTMENT OF JUSTICE, INTERNAL SECURITY - Hatch Act*, dated April 7, 1942, at Washington, D. C. reflects that RABKIN was born April 17, 1911, at New York City. He received a LL.B degree from Columbia University Law School in June, 1934, and entered the Government Service in February, 1935. He first worked as a Senior Clerk for the Department of Agriculture and on November 19, 1937, he secured employment as an investigator for the LAFOLLETTE Civil Liberties Sub-Committee. On August 1, 1938, he was engaged as a Special Attorney in the Anti-Trust Division of the U. S. Department of Commerce. He held this position until May, 1935, at which time he was appointed an Attorney for the National Labors Relations Board. In March, 1941, RUBKIN was employed as a Special Inspector for the Immigration and Naturalization Service with headquarters in New York City. He was holding that position at the time of the Hatch act investigation

Confidential sources of the Washington Field Division have advised that RABKIN's name appeared on the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and that he was a member of its investigative committee in 1940. He is also reported to have been a member of the National Youth Congress.

Then interviewed under the provisions of the Hatch Act as reflected by the report of Special Agent EDZARD F. HUMER dated July 17, 1942, at New York City, RABKIN denied being a member of the Communist Party and a member of the American League for Peace and Democracy. He admitted being a member of the Washington Bookshop, Washington, D. C., but stated that that was merely for the purpose of purchasing books.

In connection with CH RIES KRI ER's activities in Los Angeles. it is interesting to note that an item appeared in the issue of Time for May 27, 1946 therein the PATTERSON campaign is discussed. The Time article states that California Democrats had been called by Attorney General BOB KENNEY to treat each other with utual respect in the June 4 primaries and to save their spleen for Republicans in the fall, but last week both disrespect and discord cropped up. Nost of the Democratic regulars were backing ex-Congressman WILL ROGERS, JR for Senator. The Hollywood Independence Committee for the arts, Sciences and Professions, the Political Action Committee and left of center IF of L Unions were electioneering hard for Congressman ILLIS PATITIESON who has often shown an agile adherance to the Communist line". The Time article further stated that a WROGER compaigner went on the air to rattle a few skeletons in the PATTERSON closet: 1) a left wing supported candidate was a turncoat Republican. 2) He had been a vociferous isolationist. 3) In 1940 he had called F.D.R. a "warmonger". CIO PAC campaigner SLIT COMMILLY was quoted in the item as saying When we get leaders...... will be so isolated you won't be able to find them. The new party is going to be the party of the people—the worker."

January 20, 1943, at San Francisco, in the case entitled "FILTS INFOODER TTERSON, Departmental applicant, United States Harshal, Southern District of California", ELHS FECOLD P. THERSON was born in Yuba City, California on November 28, 1898, attended the University of California from 1917 to 1921, receiving an L.B. degree. Ifter several years activity in the teaching profession, P. TTERSON entered politics as assemblyman from Honterey County, California in 1932. He was admitted to the California State Bar November 1939 after attending Stanford School of Law and the University of California Law School. He was elected to the office of Lt. Governor in the state of California in 1938, serving in the administration of Governor CULVERT OLSON. He was defeated for reelection in 1942. Thile his ability is recognized by all political groups his name has appeared on letterheads.

Circulars identified PATTHEON as speaker at the mass meeting held at San Francisco on October 27, 1935 celebrating release of eight persons vincluding such known Communists as ACR OFKLIN, LEGAT YOUGHOE, C.ROLIN, and JACK SP IE, all previously convicted under the California State Criminal Syndicalism act. The December 9, 1937 issue of the Communist paper Wastern Workers published a letter from P.TTEMSON, which letter was one of greating and welcome to the "People's World", West Coast Communist news organ. The name of PITTERSON, wife of Representative P.TTERSON was found to be recorded on a receipt book of the Communist Party in Sacramento, California as having contributed to a subscription found in 1938 to take care of the financial end of the "People's World".

On January 1, 1938 P.TTE SON's name was listed in the "Daily People's World" as having sent greatings to that publication.

GLENN, dated April 16, 1946 at Mashington, D. C. This report indicated further that on October 26, 1945 she took part in a parade sponsored by an organization known as MIVES, whose members called on Army officers and Senators in Mashington, D. C. to exert pressure to get their husbands back from overseas.

The above report indicated that PELEN FRUCHT AN had been employed from September to December 1945 by Congressman GEORGE F. LILLER. Investigation did not disclose that she was at this time active in the local Communist party. However, a report in this same case written by Special Agent LEE M. FALLOW, dated January 29, 1946 at San Francisco, revealed that HELEN FRUCHTIAN was very active in Communist Party work in San Francisco until September 1945 at which time she moved to 476 N Street, S.M., Mashington, D. C. She was known to have contacted STEVE HELSON in New York City on November 10, 1945.

According to a report appearing in this same case at San Francisco, dated June 16, 1945, submitted by Special Agent JANES FREALING TANKER, HELEN FRUCHTIAN was born May 18, 1918 at New York, New York; had resided at 1325 Cabrillo Street, San Francisco, and had been employed at Kaiser Shipyard #4, Richmond, California. She was membership director of the Richmond Communist Party Club in San Francisco and was scheduled to attend C.P.A. new officers classes. She was a known contact of such active Communists as LOWIST BRANSTEN, LUCY S. LOWIST, CLEAR T. BERRY, MARION SILLS, and VIVI. A CGUCKIN. She held 1945 Communist Party card #40323. Her Musband, Lt. EDMARD J. TRUCHTAN, in the spring of 1945 was an officer in the United States air Corps. Her husband received

an LL.B degree from Columbia Law School, New York City in 1934; was affiliated after graduation with the law firm of Alcott, Paul and Havens at 40 Wall Street, New York City. He became an attorney for the Security Exchange Commission in December 1935. At a later date he joined the Department of Labor, Wages and Hour Division. He was affiliated with the Washington Committee for Democratic action, the American League for Peace and Democracy, and the Lawyers Guild. He denied membership in the Communist Party.

OLIVER FETERSON - The name of OLIVER PETERSON has not appeared so often in reports in the instant case as that of his wife, ESTHER FETERSON. However, he has been in social contact with CHERLES KRIER. Information concerning his background is set forth. According to a report in instant case, dated March 11, 1946, at Washington, D. C.,

Obscording to a memorandum dated December 19, 1945 at New York City, submitted by Special Agent W. RULON FIXE N, in this case entitled "OLIVER ENTHUR PETERSON, Security Latter - C", OLIVER PETERSON has figured in the case entitled "LYDI. LIBCHULER, Espionage - R". According to the report of Special Agent TR.CY R. OSBORNE, JR. in the case bearing the latter title and dated November 9, 1942 at New York City, OLIVER PETERSON headed the Consumers Division of OPA located on the 44th floor of the Empire State Building where LYDI. ALTSCHULER was believed to have visited October 22, 1942.

In another report on this same case, dated February 19, 1943 at New York City, OLIVER and ESTHEM PETERSON are definitely identified as acquaintances of LYDL. LITSCHULER. In his application dated July 21, 1941, submitted to the Office of Frice administration, he gave his name as OLIVER LITHUR FETERSON and his address as 411 West 114th Street. He stated he was born June 14, 1903 at Crookston, Polk County, Minnesota. He received an 1.8. degree at the University of North Dakota, took graduate work in societagy at Columbia from 1928 to 1934 and also attended Harvard. He stated that he was fluent in Norse and English. He have his wife's name as ESTHER EG ENTSON PETERSON of 868 M. University, Provo, Utah. He said he was a member of cooperatives in Boston, New York and Jashington, D. C. and a member of the Board of Directors of Cooperative Distributors in 1937. From June 1936 to July 1941 he was employed by the MPN in Mashington, D. C. and New York City.

January 11, 1944 at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, entitled "LRIE JOSEPHINE REED, with aliases, Security Matter - C", the name of OLIVER PETERSON, 265
West 14th Street, Room 1001, New York City, was contained in the address book

belonging to MARIE JOSIPHINE RELD which had been examined through highly confidential sources. The New York files showed MARIE JOSEPHINE D was a member of the Communist Party in Pittsburgh and had written a letter to OTTO MATZ in Pexico City. OTTO MATZ was the leader of the Free German Movement in Mexico. The memorandum of Special Igent 1. RULON PARA N indicated that ESTHER and OLIVER PETERSON's Mashington address was 1737 Capitol View Avenue, Silver Springs, Maryland. This memorandum indicated that ESTHER EGGENTSON STERSON came of old Mormon stock Thereas her husband's parents were born in Morday.

C., L SHERLN was employed as a publicity consultant for the Morvegian Mabassy and resided at the Cairo Hotel, Washington, D. C. He was born april 27, 1904 at New York City. According to a report of Special Agent BURT N. HELCOCK, dated September 15, 1944, in this came case SHEJIN's name appeared on the official membership records of the Communist Party for the District of Columbia as of May 1944. His address at this time was given as 519 Quackenbos Street, washington, D. C.

According to the report of JOHN ... SMARTZ in this case, dated December 1, 1944 at Washington, D. C.,

on -pril 20, 1944 he married hrs. PAULINE LAUTAN. The report of Special -gent SERIZ, dated December 13, 1944, indicates that SERELN has been notified to the Secretary of State of the Royal Morwegian Embassy.

By memorandum dated February 25, 1946, submitted by Special .gent > LORENZO LILDIAN at the mashington Field Division, LL SHERLAN and his wife, POLLY, was scheduled to be transferred into the newspaper group of the local Communist Party.

It was confidentially ascertained on May 17. 1946 that EDN AGLSS contacted MIRW HEELER and stated that DICK HITE was working for the Chicago Housing Authority. OSCAR GLSS requested EDMA to pass the word to DICX WHITE that he could come back here and work for TOPAN CORCOR'N like DUNCIN LEE is doin g. It was ascertained on May 23, 1946 MILLER contacted FRANK JEILINECK concerning a journalistic venture in Mcxico City. MILLER appeared favorable however they indicated that GREGG was somewhat unfaborably disposed. JELLINECK commented Wheell go ahead with DUNCAF LEE" indicating that LEE would take it if GREGG and MILLER did not. It was confidentially ascertained on May 25, 1946, that irs. GIBBS at the LEE residence told MIRLIN COLEMN that ISHBELLEE still hoped to make the trip to England as soon as possible. indicated that DON and MIRY THEELER would pick up the LEES that night to visit the COLENINS.

There is being set out below a summarization of the during the period data obtained from Confidential Informant May 16th through May 31st inclusive.


Confidential Informant advised that op May 17, 1946 DUNCAN LEE indicated to ISHREL LEE that 10. E DOERING was not staying as long as he had anticipated and that DOERING would be down next week.

On May 18, 1946 it was ascertained that the LEES were going to the BARNETTS for Sunday evening. The BARNETTS live at 4225 49th Street.

On May 20, 1946 MARGARET HENRY asked Mrs. GIBBS if she know what the firm TERM and BANE was in New York. Mrs. GIBBS suggested that she contact DUNCAN LEE for this information. Also on May 20, 1946 DUNCAN LEE told irs. GIBBS that the General's party was that afternoon at 5.30 PM. irs. GIBBS asked DUNCAN if MARGARETY GRIGGS got him and DUNCAN indicated that she had.

On May 20, 1946 Mrs. GEORGE/McGEE asked the LEES to join them for supper on Friday evening. The invitation was seconded.

On May 24, 1946 ISHBEL LEE told PRISCILLY LEE that PRISCILLY. was invited to dinner the next night at the COLETANS. ISHEEL stated that the TEELERS would pick them up May 25, 1946. DUNCLN LEE stated to GUY MIRTIN that he had seen CHURLIE RINE. DUNGIN indicated that RINE was with Southern Cromwell and that BINE had some shocking news about BCB HUSTON. DUNCAN stated to GUY that they were going to DON FEELER's brother in law's new house in Virginia. GUY stated that RUPPRIVILEN from Oxford



was there and would like to see DUNCAN Monday. ALLEN stated to LEE that he was at the State Department until the end of the week and then was going to Hollywood to look things over and do some writing for public relations work.

On May 26, 1916 DAVID KIRR, DRET PEARSON'S employee, contacted LEE and furnished a bulletin on the coal crises and they discussed whether LETIS would act to buck the bigger things. LTE indicated that he did not know and CARR suggested he might be able to get legislation through in time to help the seamen.

On May 28, 1946 ISHBEL LEE told DUNCAN that Uncle HUGH's address was 106 East 68th Street, New York City.

On May 29, 1946 it was determined that on July 1st DUNCAN, ISHBEL the three bids and DUNCAN's mother are going to Catham, Virginia. On the same date PRISCILL LEE contacted DUNCAN and requested the address of JOHN PRITTON which DUNCAN stated was Apartment 80b, 1437 Rhode Island Avenue, NT.

Wednesday evening. The same informant advised on the same day that MARRY MAGDOFF informed his wife BEATTIE that PEARL'S maiden name was LISCHINSKY but now was MANDELL (ph.).

On December 12, 1945 Confidential Informant advised that BEATTIE MAGDOFF told TED that the LISCHLASKYS along with SOL'S brother, were going to be present at a party at the MAGDOFF home. On the same day, the same informant indicated that REATTIE MAGDOFF contacted MELVA LISCHLASKY. MELVA said she had heard BEATTIE and thought it was very good. BEATTIE stated that MELVA'S husband had told BEATTIE the same thing. MELVA informed that she had told FAY GLASSER about the broadcast.

On January 9, 1916 Confidential Informant related that FAY GLASSER told ERMA HOSENBERG that she is having a party next Friday and wanted, in addition to others, the LISCHINSKYS (ph) to come.

May 16,1946 Informant advised that BEATTIE MAGDOFF contacted HARRY at work to ascertain if he had enough money in their bank account to pay their rent and also the rent of PEARL AXELROD.

On this date Mrs. PHIL GATES contacted BEATTIE asking the telephone number of the woman handling the reservations for the lunch the League of Women Voters was giving at the George Mason Hotel in Alexandria. BEATTIE advised Mrs. GATES that MARGARETAJONES was handling reservations. She asked Mrs. GATES to contact Mrs. TON JONES to find out whether people could come in after the luncheon when they have the radio program. Mrs. GATES told BEATTIE that they have appointed Mrs. BROWN and her niece to go to Richmond to look up all the Jim Craw laws on the books. Mrs. GATES said that Mrs. TOM JONES was President of the American Women's Party but had told Mrs. GATES to keep this a secret. BEATTIE said that they need women in the League who are well known and looked up to even though they won't be too faithful as workers.

On this date the informant advised BEATTIE contacted a Mrs. KURTZ (ph) to ascertain if she would take over the Hospitality Committee of the P.T.A. next year. Mrs. KURTZ declined.

The informant advised that BEATTIE contacted Mrs. ENDICOTT (ph) who agreed to take over the lunch committee of the P.T.A. until her husband received an over-seas assignment. On this date Mrs. SANDS (ph) accepted the duties of chairman of the Hospitality Committee for the P.T.A. during the next year.

HARRY MAGDOFF attempted to contact HERB but EDITH advised that HERB would call him later.

DOROTHY PHILLIPS (ph) advised HARRY MAGDOFF that she would visit them this evening.

On this date an unidentified man informed HARRY MAGDOFF that they desired to come over and congratulate BEATTIE on her election as President of the P.T.A. However HARRY advised him that they would not be able to come in view of a P.T.A. meeting. HARRY informed the unidentified man that BEATTIE was also in Kansas City for the League of Women Voters and the man said that the next thing BEATTIE must do is to defeat SMITH and BYRD. HARRY agreed but said that SMITH wants to run in GLASSER's place. The man told HARRY to take a look at LOWELDIMILLER in the STAR tonight. His column is on the miners. HARRY told him that he had to write a memo on it for the Cabinet meeting tomorrow.

Informant advised that HERB called H HARRY asked him if he had been thinking about the coal strike. HERB advised HARRY that he had been monkeying around with it but not very effectively. toki HARRY that KILGORE was putting in an investigation which was approved by the Education Labor Committee but it was going to be rough going. said he hoped they would fight it out to make that a substitute for the whole business, but the guys who are handling the thing are not tough floor opera-He advised HARRY that KILGORE is putting an amendment to the CASE Bill tomorrow in the way of a substitute to have federal enforcement of the safety precautions. He said that the Health bill is being considered and will also be taken up. He told HAPRY that KILGORE thought it was the right thing to do although he might "catch it" from three ways, namely, from the HERB said that the individuals were for miner, operators and state machine. it but the union guys may figure it's messing up negotiations. HARRY said the Cabinet meeting has it on the agenda tomorrow and HENRY WALLACE was wondering what his position should be with regard to the situation. HARRY said he gave Willice a memo last week pointing out that the Government is overlooking the basic issues, that there is something of real concern there that the Government is responsible for and should participate in. HERB said he was thinking what would be a Government proposal, to support JOHN L. outright or what. and it seemed to him there were two things that could be done, one is that the Government could support the proposition KILGORE is putting in tomorrow, namely federal inspection of the mines plus enforcement of the inspection.

HLRRY said that JOHN L. said the inspections were lousy but HERB HARB stated that the replied that they were very good, in fact too good. state inspections were lousy and the enforcement was worse. He pointed out that the federal government has no authority for enforcement. HARRY asked ... how the federal government could enforce them legally and HERB advised by HERB asked if the WAGNER-MURRAY-DINGLE Lct was a 50/50 proposition but HARRY did not know. HERB did not think that more than three or four per cent of the payroll was needed for medical care. He thought a five percent tax would not be out of line with the workers supplying one and a half per cent for the three per cent devoted to medical care and the two per cent from the welfare being made up entirely from the employers as an extension from the workmen's compensation. They agreed that this would be administered by the Covernment and HERB advised that there would be an Advisory Committee from the miners and the workers. HERB stated he thought that this was what WALLICE should come out for and HIRRY replied that that is what he gave HENRY in the last memo. HERB told MAGDOFF that he would even let the proposal of William sneak out because he said to him that this would be a good thing and he would also get the mine inspection in. HERB said the miners were harder



hit by cut backs than any of the other groups; that the miners make good money primarily because of working overtime. He said that the usual 18% formula could be modified here. HERB thought it would be good for WALLACE to champion the miners directly in an intelligent and straight forward manner, inclusing the whole question of wages. As HERB saw it there were only three points:-

- 1. Health and Welfare.
- 2. Mine Safety.
- 3. Wage Rates.

HERB said that WALLACE should have a good sound position, a liberal but sound position on all of these three. He said that one should be very careful of the mine safety thing; that it should also be in the contract so the workers do not have to work in any mine that is not safe. that this would be a good idea for WALLACE to follow. He wished that KILGORE was not so near election for it would be a good idea for KILGORE to de this. In HERB's opinion the Government should be in the position of a mediator on He said that if "these guys" were smart they would undercut LEWIS this way because the workers would not object to a one and a half per cent tax if they can get a supervised health and welfare fund. That is, supervised by the Public Health Service with an advisory committee from the union on the question of health and from the union and employers on the question of welfare. HERB said he would support the condition of only the union for health and both of them for the welfare.

HARRY said that it was good for the government to come in and take both sides and that he was thinking of including in his memo a statement that the Government should not consider taking over the mines unless they were ready to do two things.

1. Actually make some guarantees and to start it in the period of operations that any wage negotiations should be retroactive.

HARRY said that this sounded wonderful and that he would do something on it. He said the thing to do was to get this memo out through DREW (PEARSON?) or somebody like that. HERB told HARRY that the UAW is looking for a research man as Assistant Research Director to WICKERT. HARRY suggested MARCEL KISTIN (ph) who is trying to get the job. HERB asked what HARRY thought about HAROLD WEIN. HARRY thought WEIN a good man and s tated that MONTGOMERY and REUTHER owed WEIN a debt but he didn't think WEIN would be good for the "other guys". HERB said he knew WICHERT pretty well, having met him a lot on committee work and WEIN stopped in his office and told him



about the job. HERB advised that KILGORE was going to see SNYDER tomorrow and if he could make some suggestions to SNYDER on this whole thing it might do some good. HARRY will contact HERB before 4:00 PM when KILGORE has his appointment and let him know what has transpired at the meeting.

On this same date the informat advised that HARRY contacted ED FITZGERALD and advised ED that he was going to the 1:30 meeting tomorrow and HARRI said that he wanted his advice on a memo he is writing which is as follows:-

- 1. The Government should come out strongly for a federally enforced mine safety regulation.
- 2. That there be a compromise on the welfare business; that they divide the thing into health and welfare; that on the health they follow the WAGNER-MURRAY-DINGLE bill when operators and miners contribute one and a half per cent each and that the miners contribute two per cent for welfare which would be five per cent instead of the seven per cent LEWIS is demanding; that the health be administered by the U. S. Health Service with a miner's Advisory Committee and a joint union operator committee on the welfare.
 - 3. Is on wages. 'They may need more than 18%.

4. That the Government should seize the mines before truce is over and operate them according to the principles of this program and will work out within six months a compromise on wages, etc.

ED said that it all sounded good with the exception of the last one. ED thinks that they should seize the mines and announce that any compromise will be made retroactive and accompany this with saying that there is governmental policy. ED suggests that he talk to HERB (FUCHS) on this.

HAPRY told ED that MARCEL KISTIN called him concerning a job with WICKERT and HARRY is going to talk to ARTY (may be ARTHUR STEIN) about him.

May 17, 1946. CATHERINE STONE in Lisbon (ph) Pennsylvania, sent the following Estern Union wire to BEATTIE, "My special love and congratulations for a splendid year's work. I am brokenhearted not to be there. I know you will do a super job today. I shall be thinking of you." CATHERINE STONE was probably referring to the luncheon of the League of Women Voters to be held on

this day. The informant advised that BEATTIE contacted BETTY COULTER and told her that she could have a hour to talk at the luncheon and that approximately 140 people would attend the luncheon at the George Mason Hetel. On this date PEGGY NIERENBERG contacted BEATTIE who advised PEGGY that they would come out Sunday.

AMELIA PERAZICH contacted BEATTIE and told her that they could come for dinner any night because GEORGE, her husband, told her that this other man is on his first trip to the United States and consequently has no friends here. Therefore any night would be agreeable with him.

On this date HARRY MAGDOFF's father informed HARRY that SAMUEL MAGDOFF, a Captain in the U. S. Army, is already back and coming home next month.

The informant advised that BEATTIE MAGDOFF and Mrs. CAROLINE PLANCK discussed the Alexandria League on this date, at which time BEATTIE had two suggestions:-

- 1. That contacts be made with high school teachers and that League material be furnished the teachers.
- 2. BEATTIE felt the Alexandria League could be built up through labor groups; that they could get labor contacts from Mr. and Mrs. HARIMAN, active laborites and try to form groups among them. However BEATTIE suggested that they point out how many people the Russians lost and the fact that they don't want and can't afford another war, thereby steering away from controversial matters.

CAROLINE told BEATTIE that she can get a private unlimited business phone instal led in her home on the Oxford exchange for League business and it will give the League a listing.

On this date HERB SCHEET was advised he could reach HARRY HAGDOFF at Temple 6394 where HARRY was sitting for some friends, Lt. J. H. HEXTER, 3214 Valley Drive, Alexandria, Virginia.

May 18, 1946 BEATTIE MAGDOFF asked AMELIA PERAZICH that Wednesday, the 22d, would be all right for meeting the Russian. AMELIA said that it would be. AMELIA lives at the Albon Towers, Apartment 131, 3700 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., W ashington, D. C.

On this date HAROLD STONE attempted to contact HARRY MAGDOFF.

MAGDOFF residence on the evening of this date and was in contact with NORTON E. LONG, National Housin; Administration official, at which time he asked LONG if he could use two "sharp characters in N.H.A." LONG explained that all the CAF-15's were taken but there probably would be something available in a lower grade. LONG agreed to see the two "guys" any time. They then discussed mutual friends at "Quiens" (College) where they both taught before the war. JACK writes book reviews for the "Times". During the course of their conversation JACK mentioned that he could not understand how some of their conversation adhered to the "Party Line". LONG agreed, stating that it was the lowest form of civility. JACK invited LONG to lunch with him some time and asked him to call at the Library of Congress, Extension 209.

RUBIN (ph) BERCREEN, apparently an old friend of HARRY MAGDOFF's advised HARRY that he was in town for a short while and would like to see him for an hour or so today. RUBIN told HARRY he was staying with his brother at 5404 4th Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., and HARRY agreed to drop by this afternoon. It is noted that SHOLEM BERCREEN resides at the above address, Telephone number Randolph 5404.

On this date BEATTIE MAGDOFF and DOROTHY KAPLAN engaged in apersonal conversation. They discussed and derided a recent P.T.A. meeting during which new officers were installed. BEATTIE made fun of the oath she had to take "to hohold this and that". BEATTIE thought the whole ceremony was ridiculous. On this date BEATTIE advised PEGGY NIERENBERG that they should arrive at her house around 3:00 PM in view of the fact that they were going to drop by and see an old friend of HARRY's who went to school with HARRY when "he was three years old".

Also on this date BE/TTIE later contacted SHOLEM BERGREEN to say that they would be around about 2:30 PM.

May 19, 1946

BEATTIE and Mrs. PHIL GITES discussed the League and agreed that Mrs. CORNELISON (Ph) would be excellent as chairman. BEATTIE was afraid

that they would have to have all outsiders at the Alexandria group to begin with but would get Alexandrians later.

May 20, 1946 BEATTIE MAGDOFF advised RUTH HEXTER that they were invited out Friday night for dinner at the house of HARRY's boss, who had just returned from over-seas. HARRY's boss referred to is PHIL HAUSER, Assistant to the Secretary of Commerce.

Later on this date the informant advised that HELEN DIMOND agreed to sit for BEATTIE on Friday night.

On this date BEATTIE MAGDOFF was contacted by CAROLINE who told her that ELLEN WOODNORTH (ph) had said that the Alexandria City Councilmen do not approve the budget and she thinks someone should represent the League and read their statement. BEATTIE could not do this. BEATTIE said that ELSIE DENNISON (ph) of the Park Fairfax Group would be glad to work on the voter's committee and that she is very sincere and hardworking and her husband is likewise.

On this date the informant advised that MILDRED CHESKIN contacted BEATTIE to ask where the farm house is in Virginia that BEATTIE sometimes goes to. BEATTIE advised that it was Mrs. KING's. MILDRED's mother wants to go to a farm or someplace for the summer. Mrs. KING's a ddress is Bluemont, Virginia.

On this date BEATTIE was in contact with Mrs. HAUSER who told BEATTIE that she would expect the MAGDOFF's at 8:30 PM Friday.

HARRY MAGDOFF contacted an unidentified man who said that he just had FLORE (ph) on the phone and asked HARRY if he could come over. He told HARRY that he had some of the answers from FLORE to the problems that had been bothering him. HARRY agreed to come right over and the man asked HARRY to bring anything over that he had in his files but HARRY said that he didn't know of anything that he cound find there.

May 21, 1946 BEATTIE declined an invitation from MARY BARR, President of the Fairfax League of Women Voters to speak before the Falls Church group on May 22d,

On this date SETH LEVINE, CIO Maritime Committee, who is well known to this office, was advised that he could reach HARRY at the residence of Lieut. J. H. HEXTER, Temple 6394. BEATTIE informed SETH that HARRY had taken





his papers with him and was doing some work. Later on this date the informant advised that HARRY was in contact with BEATTIE and told her that he is "having some guys join him at the house (HEXTERS)". He told BEATTIE that if the HEXTERS come home early he will being them to the house.

On this date BEATTH told EMILIE STEWART (Ph) that she was leaving on June 15th.

The informant advised that PEGGY NIERENBERG contacted BEATTIE on this date and BEATTIE told PEGGY that HARRY is teaching a course in Agriculture next year and they wanted him to teach a second course on "Crops and their Control". She further told PEGGY that her cousin, BETTY, quit her job and just accepted a new job with the Maritime Union in Maine.

May 22, 1946 BETTY MITCHELL advised BENTTIE how to reach the meeting place for the League group. She explained to BENTTIE that the meeting room was under the administrative offices of Irlington Village on the Columbia Pike. BENTTIE will address the meeting on the next convention and the set up of the League since this is a new group.

On this date HARRY MAGDOFF contacted BEATTIE and told her that they had received two more invitations for Saturday night, one of them was from the NUSSBAUS. However, they were going to the STONE's on Saturday night.

On this date BELTTIE contacted in TONLSAVICH (ph) Yugoslav Division of UNRRA to invite him a nd his wife to dinner on Friday night, the 31st, at BELTTIE's home. Mr. TOMLSAVICH accepted for both himself and Nr. CROSHAK.

On this date BELTTIE contacted TELL. PERAZICH and expressed her pleasure at the party last night. She informed TELL. that she had invited Mr. TONASAVICH and Mr. CROSHAK for dinner on Friday, the 31st, and asked TELL. if she and GEORGE could come. THELL was uncertain because GEORGE and CROSHAK had reservations on the Queen Mary which sales on June 1st. They probably will leave early because CROSHAK wanted to do some shopping for his wife and daughter in New York. Subsequent to this on this same date BELTTIE contacted Mr. TOHLSAVICH to advise that Mr. CROSHAK was leaving on Wednesday, May 29th.

May 23, 1916 HARRY advised BEATTIE that he would contact DAVE NUSSBAUM and invite him for dinner on Wednesday, However, NUSSBAUM subsequently advised BEATTIE that he could attend the Sednesday dinner but his wife would be unable to because of the illness of her father.

On this date BEATTIE contacted an unidentified woman and suggested four points to be included in the League group's program on rationing. They are:-

1. That letters be written to ANDERSON and TRUMAN to ask return of rationing.

That letters be written to newspapers.
 That letters be written by members to newspapers back home.

On this date JOAN DE WIND invited BEATTIE for dinner Friday.

BEATTIE explained that they had six invitations already. BEATTIE tells JOAN that she will be away from June 15th to August 15th. JOAN is trying to get a scholarship job at Vassar for the term beginning July 10th so her husband, BILL, would be at MAGDOFF's for the time HARRY is away.

On this date the informant advised that HARRY MACDOFF was in contact with ED FITZGERALD who said that he met KAPPY at lunch time that day. FITZGERALD and MAGDOFF discussed the railroad strike and ED advised HARRY that he was glad they pulled the strike. MAGDOFF said, "It's very significant that it clarifies the issues." FITZGERALD told HARRY "I don't think what the President offered was what they could have accepted earlier" and HARRY told FITZGERALD that "The President didn't offer them anything better. He is a first class dope."

On this d ate SYLVIA ZISKIND was contacted by BEATTIE who told her that she had been to a meeting of a new group at Colonial Village. She asked SYLVIA when her group met and if they were expecting her. SYLVIA said the meeting is at 1:30 PM and that they were expecting BEATTIE. BEATTIE said she spoke with CATHERINE about what "that fellow" told us about, and then asked SYLVIA what his name was. SYLVIA advised it was DOUL BENNETT. BEATTIE told SYLVIA that CATHERINE said the League had already planned to have a League speaker on the air to answer Mr. LEVIS but she doesn't know what success they were having.

On this date BEATTIE MAGDOFF and CAROLINE POT NKIN discussed one ALMA who lives with CAROLINE. ALMA is in Buffalo as a representative of the Association of Social Workers. BEATTIE and CAROLINE discussed the rail-road strike, both agreeing that TRUMAN is a "Jackass and a dope." BEATTIE stated that labor is against TRUMAN and she now thinks the general public "hates his guts".

May 25, 1946 Informant advised that the MAGEOFFS were to visit the FITZGERALDS on this date.

May 26, 1946 A man by the name of BEN endeavored to contact the MAGDOFFS on this date, and HARRY MAGDOFF believed the party may have been BEN HAMDLER and contacted MANDLER in the carly morning of this day but was advised that HAMDLER did not call MAGDOFF.

MELIA PERIZICH advised BEATTIE that she believes TOMASAVICH (ph) will be gone by Wednesday and that he will not be able to come to BEATTIE's.

MELIA said that BEATTIE could get TOMASAVICH at DE 7300, Ext. 209, 350 and 5730. BEATTIE replied, "Well, we'll see you, JOSEPH and his wife, anyway."

MELVA doesn't know if SOL is still interested in living there or not during the summer menths and she believes that he would prefer to rent cut part of his house and retain a room for himself.

HARRY said that the Secretary has indicated a number of times he was ready to do it if necessary (resign) and suggested the possibility that WALLACE would see ELEANOP MOOSEVELT.

ED FITZGER LD said that this might confuse WALLACE and that WALLACE also could be talking to HENRY MORGENTHAU while he was up there.

Later on this date the Informent advised HARRY MIGDOFF contacted ELLEM PERIO who advised HARRY that they could not make it to Glen Echo so HARRY suggested that they make arrangements to get together soon.


Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER in this cast dated June 5, 1946, where on any 3rd, 1946, informant vised that EDITIMEBSTER (Ph) invited the MAGDOFFS for dinner.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent WILLIAM
C. GALLEMORE:-

The telephone directory has NATHAN WECHSLER and Nrs. REBECCA WECHSLER listed as living at 6601 lith Street, N.W. and gives the telephone number as Taylor 5343. The writer placed a call to that number and was told by the unknown lady answering that neither an EDITH WEBSTER nor an EDITH WECHSLER lived there.

The Stone's Mercantile Agency has the following information in its records on EDITH WEBSTER:— As of November 21, 1938, she resided at 3000 Connecticut Avenue, N.V. She was single and about 27 or 28 years of age. Her legal name is EDITH WECHSLER, but she uses the name of WEBSTER in business life. Mrs. SAMUEL WECHSLER, her mother, resides at 231 Ocean Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, and when contacted, advised that her daughter had been in Washington, D. C. for the past seven months. Prior to that she lived with her parents at 231 Ocean Avenue, for six to eight menths. For two years prior to that she resided at 441 Ocean Avenue, Brooklyn, New York; from 1935 until late 1937 she was a stenographer with Shead and Company, 205 E. 42nd Street, New York. Employed as a secretary by L. P. Stewart, Inc., 1440 P. Street, N.W. Washington, D. C. from a bout November 1, 1938, to date of report, November 21, 1938.

In a report dated January 9, 1940 on file at The Credit Bureau, the following information is given on EDITH J. ECHSLER. Address given as 2206 Eye Street, N.W. #4. She is 26 years of age and single. Has resided at above address for one year. She formerly lived at 1900 "" Street, N.W. #828 for about two years. Employed by the Social Security Board as an Assistant Statistical Clerk. She was appointed to this position of April 19, 1937, her mother Mrs. Louis or Adolphe Medisler lives at 409 Tompkins Avenue, Rosebank, Staten Island, New York.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent ZANDER in this case dated May 17, 1946, wherein Informant advised that on April 24th HARRY MAGDOFF asked BEATTIE MAGDOFF to invite DAVID NUSBAUM for dinner.

Further, on April 17th, the same informant advised that HARRY told BEATTIE that DAVID NUSBAUM of Life Magazine was going to Charlottes-ville on April 18th, and could take BEATTIE and CATHERINE STONE with him.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent O. J. TORYBOM:-


The following information was obtained from the Credit Bureau from a report dated October 19, 1945. At the time of the report, DAVID NUSBAUM was a Lieutenant (jg) in the U. S. Navy. He was formerly employed by TIME, INC. as a research worker in the Editorial Dept. from February, 1941, until April, 1942.

His wife, MRS. MARIE HANSE (MUSBAUM is 25 or 26 years of age, white, and has no children. At the time of the credit report she was employed by Life Magazine at 815 15th Street, N.W., Washington, D. C. as a photographer and was transferred here in September, 1945, from the New York office where she had been employed for four and a half years. Her address is listed as 1727 Massachusetts avenue, N.W. Washington, D. C. (Winthrop House). The current telephone directory reflects a DAVID MUSBAUM at 4022 Georgia avenue, N.W. and a telephone number as Randolph 8231.

Stone's Mcrcantile Agency was checked with negative results.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent ZANDER in this matter dated May 17, 1946, where, under the heading of "Physical Surveillance" in the material pertaining to subject MAGDOFF, it was reported that PAUL A LI and FRIEDIANALLIN gave a dinner at the Chinese Lantern Inn which the MAGDOFFS attended on the evening of April 19th. During the surveillance it appeared that PAUL WALLIN was wearing a uniform similar to one worn by an officer in the United States Army. However, an appropriate check by Special Employee JOHN SULLIVAN in the War Department failed to reveal any record of PAUL WALLIN.





Inasmuch as previous inquirics regarding WALLIN have reflected that he is from Santa Ana, California, which city is covered by the San Diego Field Division office, that office is being requested to ascertain background data regarding WALLIN.

deted March 1, 1946, where on page 63 it is reported that on January 28, 1946, HERVAN or IRVINACEDDLESBERG (ph) contacted MARRY MAGDOFF and said he was scheduled to give a talk on "Russia in World Trade" at Rollins College in Florida and had been having difficulty in locating material. This reference further reflects that EDDLESBERG is acquainted with subject IRVING KAPLAN and with the following individuals who are close friends of the MAGDOFFS:- V. IEWIS BASSIE, ED FITZGERALD, who is also a subject in this case, and ED STONE. It has been a scertained that HERMAN EDDELSBERG resides at 2141 "B" Suitland Terrace, S.E. Fairfax Village, Telephone Trinidad 8425.

Page two of the daily teletype summary dated May 22, 1946, from the Washington office to the Bureau and New York reflects that

It is to be noted that Informant advised that on May 29th the MAGDOFFS were giving a dinner and that DAVE USBAUM, AMELIA and GEORGE PERIZICH, a subject in this case, ED and REBECCA FITZGERALD, JOE FISHER and NADA were invited.

The informant as reported above has advised that DAVE NUSBAUM, REBECCA FITZCER'LD and NADA were present at the dinner on Hay 29th.

29th by Special Zents H. DUDLEY PAYNE and AUBREY S. BRENT revealed the following information:-

Lt 7:25 pm a man described as 35, $5!10\frac{1}{2}$, 175 lbs., brown hair, light complexion, grey suit, brown hat, carrying a brown top coat, walked from MARTHA CUSTIS DRIVE to the MAGDOFFS! apartment at 3226 Ravensworth. It may be that this unidentified person is DAVE NUSRAUM.

Webster Street, NW. Apartment #6, Telephone Taylor 8469, revealed that he picked up these passengers at the A. B. & W. bus stop, at 12th and Pennsylvania Avenue, in Washington, D. C. He described the man who sat in front with him as 32 to 35 in years, 5'9\frac{1}{2}", 165 lbs., spoke with a clear accent. He described the man who sat in the back seat with the two lalies as 35 to 38 years old, spoke with a foreign accent. He was unable to furnish any description of the lady passengers. He said that the men talked about some friends of theirs going back to Prague about the first of the month. They also conversed concerning construction work. 

L. MARKS of Danville, Pennsylvania, telephone numbers 592-W and 798-R. The Philadelphia Field Division was asked to ascertain the identity of the caller and in a letter dated May 27, 1946, advised this office that the caller was ROBERT L. MARKS, father of HERBERT SIMON MARKS, who resides at 205 West Market Street, Danville, Pennsylvania, residence telephone number 798-R and business telephone number 592-W. ROBERT L. MARKS owns and operates a men's furnishing store at 290-296 Mill Street in Danville and has operated that business for over thirty years. It is reported that he has been a

resident of Danville for a longer period and that he has an excellent reputation both commercially and personally. He is vice-president of the Danville National Bank and reportedly owns considerable stock in this bank. ROBERT L. MARKS is a widower with two sons, both of whom reside in Danville and assist him in his business. These sons are ROYAL L. MARKS and VICTOR J. MARKS. Both have excellent personal reputations. It was also reported that the third son, HERBERT S. MARKS, is supposed to be an attorney for the Government and has been characterized as the "smart aleck" type. This family is of Jewish extraction. With reference to ROBERT L. MARKS, as has been previously stated, no derogatory information was developed. He never travels and lives a very quiet life.

Las the result of a mail cover placed on the subject's residence, 1518 26th Street, N. J., Washington, D. C., it was ascertained that MARKS received a letter postmarked May 6, 1946, from 4615 Penn Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It was requested of the Philadelphia Field Division that they ascertain the identity of the sender and in a letter dated May 27, 1946, they advised that the sender of the letter was BERNICE MARKS ADELIAN, a stenographer, born April 29, 1918, at Catawissa, Pennsylvania. Further information about her in the Registration Commission shows that she is a life-long resident of Pennsylvania and has lived two and one-half years in the present election district. On April 26, 1945, the date she registered, she was described as follows:

No further information was furnished on BERNICE MARKS ADEL AN and no further investigation is being made by the Philadelphia Field Division.

C., revealed that the occupant of room W-403 who had registered as Dr. OPPENHEIMER, an individual previously referred to in these reports, had made three telephone calls to MARKS, one at his home and two at his office (Republic 5600, extension 2161), and at 9:07 Am had left a request at the switchboard of the hotel that if he had any incoming calls that morning, that they be relayed to Republic 5600, extension 2161, which is known to be the business office of MARKS. It is to be noted that a physical surveillance maintained at the State Department on that date failed to confirm any meeting of OPPENHEIMER and MARKS.



Physical Surveillances

As the result of a physical surveillance maintained at the home of the subject, 1518 26th Street, N. W., it was determined that on this date at 9:23 AM the subject left his residence and walked to Q Street, N. W., and hailed a taxicab, license number 20934, and proceeded down Connecticut Avenue to the corner of 17th and G Streets, N. W. MARKS paid the cab driver, crossed the street and entered the northwest 17th Street entrance of the State Department building at 9:37 AM. Continued surveillance that day failed to reflect any further activity on the part of the subject.

As the result of a physical surveillance maintained on May 16, 1946, at the southwest entrance of the State Department building, it was noted that at 2:00 PM the subject walked down the street with an unidentified white man and engaged the unidentified man in conversation for several minutes at the foot of the steps by the soutwest entrance of the State Department building. When they parted, MARKS entered the building and the unidentified man proceeded down 17th Street to Constitution Avenue, going to Constitution Avenue and 18th Street, N. W., where he entered the Navy Department building. It was observed that this man occupies a glass partitioned office to the left of the entrance of Room 1026 of this building. It was also noted that these offices are occupied by the Fiscal Director. The observed description of the unidentified man is as follows:



Further efforts will be made to ascertain the identity of the unidentified man and will be reported in the next report.

On May 17, 1946, the subject was observed to leave the southwest entrance of the State Department building and to proceed up 17th Street to Casey's restaurant located on 17th Street between F and G Streets, N. W. MARKS entered the restaurant and had luncheon. It is to be noted that MARKS dined alone and at 2:00 PM left the restaurant and retraced his steps to the State Department building, entering the building at approximately 2:06 PM. No further activity was noted on the part of MARKS on this day.

A physical surveillance maintained at the residence of MARKS, 1518 26th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., revealed that at 9:20 AM MARKS appeared and walked up 26th Street to East Street and hailed a taxicab

operated by W. H. PETTY, license number 18518. As the taxicab proceeded down Connecticut Avenue, it was hailed by a middle-aged woman who accompanied the subject for the rest of the trip to the State Department Building. MARKS disembarked at the State Department building and entered the northwest 17th Street entrance. The woman passenger proceeded to the Federal Reserve Building, 20th and Constitution Avenue, N. W., entering the building at approximately 9:35 AM.

On May 21, 1946, a physical surveillance maintained at the residence of MARKS at 1518 26th Street, N. W., from 3:15 PM to 8:45 PM revealed no activity on the part of the subject on this day.

On May 22, 1946, a physical surveillance conducted from 3:30 PM to 9:00 PM reflected no activity on the part of the subject other than at 5:05 PM the subject's wife, driving their car, arrived at home and at 5:08 PM the subject's wife and child walked up and down in front of the house, going into the house soon after. There was no other activity on this day.

The physical surveillance maintained at the subject's residence, 1518 26th Street, N. N., on May 2h, 19h6, at 5:50 PM revealed that an elderly, gray-haired woman walked up the street to the subject's home and rang the front door bell. Since there was no apparent answer to the summons, she left the subject's residence and walked back down the street, proceeding along P Street, 27th Street, down 27th Street to Dumbarton Street, and entering a house on Dumbarton Street between 27th and 28th Streets. She was observed to be wearing a gray dress with yellow figures and a small, white, frilly hat and black shoes and she was ascertained to be from fifty to fifty-five years of age.

At 6:05 PM the subject's wife and an unidentified woman wearing a gray suit, red blouse, a Leghorn hat, and accompanied by the subject's child walked up 26th Street from P Street and entered the subject's residence.

At 6:10 PM the subject's child came out and played in front of the house, being supervised in his play at 6:25 by the unidentified woman. The unidentified woman and the child reentered the house at 6:40 PM.

At 7:10 PM MARKS walked from P Street up 26th Street to his residence and entered it. It is to be noted the subject evidently came from the bus stop on P Street.

At 7:15 PM the subject, wearing a blue suit, and his wife, wearing a red dress with large white polka dots and a fur neckpiece, got into their car and proceeded through downtown Washington to the Dodge Hotel, Union Circle Plaza. The subject parked his car in a parking lot across from the Dodge Hotel while his wife waited on the sidewalk. In a few minutes the

subject joined his wife and together they proceeded into the Dodge Hotel, stopping first in the lobby and then getting into the elevator. Because of the physical setup of the lobby, it was impossible, without being observed, to ascertain the immediate destination of the couple. Subsequent efforts failed to reflect their immediate destination. At 9:10 PM the subject and his wife reappeared, walked down the street to the parking lot, and proceeded back through downtown Washington to their home. Subsequent efforts to ascertain the room which the subject and his wife visited have resulted negatively.

Inter on the same day MILLER contacted the Parkside Hotel in New York City and asked to speak to Mrs. CARROLL JANEWAY. 

On May 17, 1946, BEADIE LAGDOFF contacted Mrs. FERAZICH to ascertain what night the PERAZICHES would be able to visit them, and AFELIA advised they could make it most any night as it was the first trip to this country for her Russian friend from Yugoslavia, and consequently, he did not know anyone here.

On May 18, 1946, BEADIE and A'ELIA made arrangements for the FERA-ZICHES to visit the MAGDOFFS on May 22, 1946, and bring their Russian friend with them.

On May 22, 1946, BEIDIE MAGDOFF contacted Mrs. PERAZICH and requested that they come to her house for dinner on May 31, 1946. At this time she also invited Mr. TOMASAVICH and Mr. KRASIUKA. AMELIA told BEADIE they could not come on the 31st as ŒORŒ and KRASIUKA had reservations on the Queen Mary which was sailing from New York on June 1, 1946. In view of this, they agreed to make the dinner engagement for May 29, 1946.

On May 24, 1946, BEADIE contacted AMELIA to say she was expecting them on the 29th. AMELIA told BEADIE they had been to a wedding at the Embassy the previous night and had a wonderful time. She also mentioned YORSEL was there and asked about BEADIE.

On May 26, 1946, AMELIA contacted BEADIE and advised her that TOMASAVICH would not be with them on the 29th as he had gone to New York.



On the same date JOAN REDMONT contacted Pan American Airways to obtain her flight number to Buenos Aires and was advised she is scheduled to leave Washington by way of Eastern Airlines at 10:45 a.m., May 29, 1946, on flight No. 3 and will arrive in Miami, Florida, at 5:51 p.m., the same date. She was scheduled to leave Miami at 4 p.m., May 30, 1946.

The informant stated SIKOV's father and mother were both Jewish and reside at 74 Vine Street, Natrona, Pennsylvania, the father having a well established business as half owner of the "Fair Store," a men's clothing store at Natrona, Pennsylvania. SIKOV was reported to have been practicing law in Natrona for approximately ten years with the exception of the period spent in the U. S. Army. It was determined SIKOV is registered with Local Board 10, Tarentum, Pennsylvania, having order number 2,374.

He was born June 13, 1911, at Fittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The person listed as knowing his address was ABE SIKOV, 74 Vine Street, Natrona, Pennsylvania. SIKOV is unmarried. He was inducted into the armed services on March 6, 1942. A questionnaire executed by SIKOV indicated he attended the University of Pittsburgh receiving an A. B. degree and a law degree. His army serial number was 0-1,171,357. He was discharged from the Army as a captain on April 29, 1946, at Camp Atterbury, Indiana, having served in the Claims Service Department in the Western Pacific Area. It was reported the files of the University of Pittsburgh contained nothing derogatory concerning SIKOV.





Before leaving she desired to have a chat with him. He suggested that she come down to his office at 1822 Jefferson Place, N. W. on the following morning at 9:30.

(Special Agent O. J. TORNED was advised by the assistant manager, R. KENN TREMARY of the Wardman Park Hotel, that the hotel register reflected the names of Dr. and Mrs. VAN DELAEM and Dr. and Mrs. KAYER for the night of May 17, 1946. The home address listed was II55 Park Avenue, New York City. A check of the Washington Field Office indices failed to reflect any record of Mrs. VAN DELAEN.)

On May 18, REWA ______ chatted with the subject's wife, ERNA, about the party that had been given the preceding night at the ROSENBERGS. Among the guests were mentioned LESTER COMEN, LILLIE POSNER, WARREN and EMILY CHARFTEN, MILLIEM and BEATRICE ROPLOVITZ, HANK and CHARLOTTE DOX, RATIOLS and NATHAN HALPERIN.

On May 20, ERMA was in conversation with EMILY SCHARFIAN and ERMA told her that ALLEN had not yet reached LEO _____. She said they would probably invite ARTIZATACH who should fit in well. (Reference is probably to a party).

On this same day, F.N. GLASSER also talked to ERNA ROSENBERG. FAY, who is the wife of HAROLD GLASSER, subject in instant case, said that on the preceding Thursday she had attended the Hayflower party given inhonor of President ROXAS, new president of the Philippines. Among the guests was TOM CLARK, the Attorney General. F.Y said that on Saturday night there was a big party at the BERNSTEINS for the T.YIORS who had just returned from London. (Reference is to HILLIAM H. T.YIOR, subject in this case, who had been a representative of the Treasury Department in England, and who upon his recent return to the United States entrained with his wife and two children for the West Coast.)

FAY stated that on Sunday night, IOL. GUENTHER (ph) and two girls were at her home for supper. These girls are going to occupy the TAYLOR home in London. F.Y mentioned that on the following Saturday night she and her husband were invited to a cocktail party at PETE CURYATA'S (ph) and then to a party at the EERENSONS (ph). ERNA ROSTABERG at this point made the observation that the only parties attended by her and her husband in years have been those given by themselves. F.Y said that on Friday she gave a farewell lunch for GIL NEYERS who was joining her husband in Germany. She said that besides her mother and father. nieces and nephews, CHURLIE and MIRGO had been guests of hers. FLY and ERNI at this time discussed a play entitled "On Whitman Avenue". The author of this play, MAXINE WOOD, is their common friend. They mentioned that some of the New York papers said the play was propaganda. They expressed great eagerness to see it for they believed it was "terrific". (...cording to a review appearing in Time magazine on May 20, 1946 the play "On Whitman Avenue", produced by C.M.D. LEE and HARK HARVIN in association with GEORGE McLAIN, deals with a negro family which moves into a gentile white neighborhood and are eventually forced out as a result of racial friction. The Time reviewer described the play as flattish propaganda and flatter theatre).

At the corclusion of her conversation with FLY GLASSER, ERM. mentioned ALLEN would be going to Boston, hassachusetts for the week in June. ERM. said she did not think she would accompany him.

On May 28, CLAYTON SELTH asked ERM, and ELEN ROSE/BERG to have cocktails and Chinese dinner with her on June 5 or 6. RNA begged off on the grounds that her husband would be going to Boston on Saturday might and would be gone until the following Sunday, and besides ERMA'S mother was coming to visit. CLAYTON and ERMA decided they would have a dinner party at 7:00 p.m. on June 12.

On this same day, May 28, MALIN ROSHNBERG told ERNA that BILL KOPLOVITZ had referred a case to him involving a cooperative that was supposed to have come to ROSENBERG in the first place but went to BILL instead. MALEN said it had been decided to start this cooperative in New York—— an F.M. station, hearings on which would begin in July. It would be a "sweat" to get started but it would be worth \$2000.00.

During the period of this report, May 16 to May 31 inclusive, no physical surveillances were conducted.

The mail cover maintained on ALLEN R. ROSENEE G's residence at 6955 Brooks Lane, Brookmont, Maryland, had no productive results.







SALKIND, while an employee of the Department of Agriculture, was employed as Associate Social Science Analyst and was reported to be a member of the Washington Book Shop, the Ancrican League for Peace and Democracy, and the Washington Committee to aid China. It has been indicated that his name appeared on the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and it was stated that SALKIND was opposed to America's interference in European affairs and the Selective Service Act until Russia's entrance into the War and later favored all aid to Russia and Britain.

It has been determined that while an employee for the Farm Security Administration, Salkind was a close friend of Marcel Kistin, a fellow employee. It will be noted that during the period that person previously identified as CAULKINS was visiting the SASULY's, he endeavored to contact Marcel Kistin, and it will be noted that Kistin was among those invited to the party given by the SILVERIASTER's.

It will be noted that during the surveillance conducted at the home of DAVIS SNOW, 3230 N Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., on April 17, 1946, which was attended by ELIZABETH SASULY and many others, an automobile was observed departing from SNOW's residence and proceeding to 3121 Quebec Place, Northwest, Washington, D. C. It has been determined that this residence is listed to DAVID LAKROOTH.

A review of the files of the Washington Field Office indicates that DAVID L. KROOTH in Harch, 1912, was employed as an Associate General Counsel, United States Housing Authority, Federal Works Agency, and that he was included in the House Un-American Activities Committee's list of

government employees engaged in Un-America Machivities. An investigation failed to disclose any Un-American activities on the part of KROOTH, or membership in subversive groups. This investigation was reported by Special Agent W. D. CRONIN, Washington, D. C., and dated March 5, 1942.

RE: HELEN SJOTT

From a confidential source known to special Agent KENNERLY R. CORBETT the following information furnished by references of HELEN SCOTT and regarding HELEN SCOTT'S background was obtained.

SCOTT'S full name is HELEN GRACE RESWICK SCOTT KEENAN and her address formerly was 1331 30th Street, N. W., Washington, D. D. One of her references given on an application was S. P. KAIDANOVSKY Chief. Research and Technical Service Division, Procurement Division, Treasury Department, Room 6046, 7th and D Streets, S. W., Washington, D. J., who was referred to as having been one of SCOTT'S supervisors in the Department of Agriculture from 1938 to 1939.

ALICE/WAYSON, Contributing Editor, Time Magazine, Number 14 West 49th Street, New York City, on January 4, 1946, reported that she had known HELEN SCOTT four or five years and recommended her very highly, according to this confidential source.

JOAN ROLKER, Copy Reader, Time Magazine, also recommended SCOTT very highly, stating that SCOTT was a loyal American citizen.

Mrs. I JOHANNET, Chief, Advertising Department Pour La Victoire, newspaper, 535 5th Avenue, New York City, also listed as a reference of SCOTT, was unable to furnish any derogatory information regarding SCOTT.

LOUIS J DAUNAU, Advertising Manager, Pour La Victoire, 535 5th Avenue, New York City, stated that he first knew SCOTT in 1940 and stated, "Miss Scott was quite touchy as far as her American patriotism was concerned. We found that she often came to the defense of American principles far faster than one would normally expect of her. She would stand for no criticism in regard to American Democratic theories and practices and principles."

Mme DENNERY, Chief, General Secretarial, French Mission des Colonies, 111 Broadway, New York City, stated that she had known HELEN SCOTT for a period of four or five years but that she did not like SCOTT inasmuch as SCOTT is an introvert, and "She tells me that she is clever and marvelous and so I agree with her, but I still keep an open mind and discount half what she says." Mme DENNERY suggested that Mr. SKAGAN in Washington, D. C. would be in a better position to furnish information regarding SCOTT and stated that KAGAN once had charge of the Brazzaville Radio in North Africa and he could be contacted through Mr. BARREL, Services Administratiss, 1704 18th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

BEKNARD G. SHERAU, Assistant Director, French Press and Information Service, 501 Madison Avenue, New York City, stated that he knew very little about HELEN SCOTT either derogatory or otherwise.

It has been determined that HELEN G. SCOTT of 1815 17th Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., registered at the Meridian Hill Hotel, Washington, D. J. for the period from May 7, 1946 to May 12, 1946, and upon her departure did not leave a forwarding address. It was reported that SCOTT did not make a reservation at this hotel in advance. It has also been determined that at SCOTT'S former address, 1815 17th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., she has left no forwarding address; that she has received no mail at that address.

SCOTT told JOAN REDMONT that she was planning to leave for New York City the following day. Inasmuch as sources of information available to this office have been unable to furnish any information regarding SCOTT'S present whereabouts, it is probable that SCOTT is now residing in New York City.

JOAN REDMONT contacted the RAILWAY EXPRESS AGENCY discussing some of her baggage which was to be picked up by the RAILWAY EXPRESS AGENCY. It was subsequently determined that this baggage consisted of three pieces, addressed as follows:

These pieces of baggage were shipped by way of RAILWAY EXPRESS Receipt Number 76-05-07. The contents of this baggage were made available to Special Agents KENNERLY R. JORNETT and GEORGE E. DAVIS by a most highly confidential source known to those Agents.

The following articles of possible significance were noted in addition to information which had previously been provided by most highly confidential sources to Agents of this office:

(1) Letter dated Wednesday, April 12, 1944, in French, bearing the typed letterhead "Heliopolis House Hotel, Heliopolis, Jairo," addressed "My dear Helen" and signed "Pierre". A translation of this letter is quoted as follows:



"I am still at Jairo awaiting probable post in Algiers. Meanwhile, I hope to leave, if not next Friday, at least the following Friday, that is to say on April 21st. This stay is far from being unpleasant. I have met many friends here, seen beautiful things, have learned some interesting news; and above all, I have rested well. First of all, I have been staying with Raoul's brother, then I returned to the Heliopolis Hotel where I enjoy more comfort and independence. The weather is perfect and the sun invigorating. Cairo is a cosmopolitan city, inhabited by all types of people and talking all languages. The city's panorama, seen from the citadel or from the fourteenth floor is magnificent with color; terraces, minarets and cupolas with the nobly austere pyramids in the background or cliffs which dominate the city. The Nile, green or orange, varying with the seasons, palm trees, a caravan of camels complete the traditional oriental setting. My visit to the Pyramids with Costa one Sunday afternoon impressed me most as it was a wonderfully clear day. But I aid not come here as a tourist.

"Since the war Cairo is also general allied headquarters of the Middle East and Balkan capital. One meets military people, men and women, of all the allied armies. The worldly center is the hall at Shepheara's Hotel where one meets British officers escerting such women as one might see in the American espionage films and men of state whose life appears to be a series of ministerial crisis. For the last ten days or so, one may meet the Governor General and his family. The atmosphere is rather unreal and fanciful, but the results of the passing event appear to be strongly joited from time to time.

"Here is the schedule of my rencounters: Raoul, always in contact with Schumberger (presently in Syria), leads a very worldly and active life while awaiting the formalities for his departure to Afghanistan to be regulated. I met his parents who are very hospitable. I had the great pleasure to meet Costa again, presently Lt. in the Greek army and working in the Greek Intelligence Department. Some time ago he was very ill with jaundice, but he is very well at the present time. He told me about all his experiences during the campaigns at Libya, Tunisia, Sicily and Italy as War Correspondent with the Greek troops and the Greek Navy. He still views life with the same interest, the same humor but also with a more profound understanding than formerly. I am very much interested in his friendship.

"The danger - (is it truly he?) who assists me a great deal, as you know, arranged to have me meet Jenkins here, the best comrade whom I had in the R. A. F. unit to which I was attached in France. I met him again with as much pleasure as I did Costa. He is much more serious, more mature, more interesting than he was four years ago without having lost any of his vitality. Again luck (actually pursues me) brought me face to face with a comrade from the Lycee Louis-le-Grand, who was passing through Cairo. I had not seen him for 14 years, but immediately found ourselves in harmony. He



has now left for Jerusalem and Istanbul where he is a delegate of the C. F. L. M. His name is Manac'h (?) and worked for a long time in Turkey with Jouve whom he likes very much, in spite of numerous quarrels with He had arrived from Algiers where Jouve informed him of the situation and asked him to see me when passing through Cairo. According to what he told me, Jouve dissolute at first now demonstrates a great activity. He is short of help like all other services in Algiers. The most informed place for me appears to be in London where there is a great deal of work to be done. this light, I have written to Jouve and Manac'h (?) is to wire him from Jerusalem. As you may guess, I am anxious to be in Algiers and urge the delegation for my departure. I see them almost daily for that reason and also to meet the various ones. There, I see Le Guevel, particularly, who manages The Marseillaise at Cairo, a Breton who is very congenial, (Freeman, a Britisher of the F. F. L. who promised to find me an English writer (or might also be editor) for Brazzaville, Dement, chief of intelligence who is looking for an Arabian writer for us. I have seen the Eboue's rather often. I was particularly busy with kaoul, as we worked together on the conference (lecture) given by the Governor at the French Lycee and which was very well received. For two days Eboue has been at the hospital with an attack of paludism (malarial disease). Following his receivery, they will go to Alexandria for a visit, and then go to Jerusalem and then Beyrout. met Mme. Melle (?) again, ex-Mme. Sol, who works at the branch establishment of the British Ministry of War Information. She seems very happy and sends her very best regards to all those whom she knew at Brazzaville. She informed me that Quigley, Lt. in the American army, is presently in Jairo, but I have not seen him.

"As you see, my days are quite busy. I spend some very happy moments with Costa, Jenks, Raoul and Le Guevel, but I am very anxious to be settled and to see Algiers. The change in climate has helped me a great deal and I am beginning to get a bit of energy and hope to get some color back and also a bit of weight.

"The date of my departure being uncertain, I sent the courier (?) which had been entrusted to me at Brazzaville for Jouve and Bonnet. It has left in the diplomatic pouch, by plane, Friday last. I shall busy myself for you, from the moment of my arrival in Algiers and you may all depend upon me to do the best possible with the errands and measures with which I have been charged.

"As for you, I hope you succeeded in sending me cash, my bottle-case and my other matters with Le Boulanger. If my departure is not soon, it will reach Algiers before I do. Also, I hope that Bernard considered my message of the 24th very carefully. If it is sent to me by courier, it is best to send it to me: "in care of Mr. Jouve, Agency France Afrique Algiers."

"How goes Radio-Brazzaville since my departure? I have not had the occasion to listen to it as yet. Have new ones arrived yet? Without doubt, Lespinasse who was expected at the time of my departure. Has the appointment of a new director been announced? I learned nothing in regard to that matter here. Nothing decided as yet, Manac'h (?) informed me upon his arrival here from Algiers. He also had heard the name of Gaulanier mentioned.

"Helen dearest, be assured that I do not forget you and that I think of you many times with affection and gratitude. You are one of the kindest persons I have ever met. Send my regards to everyone.

- (2) Letter dated February 20, 1946, addressed "Ma Petite Helen" signature illegible, bearing the return address, 15 Rue Jacques Bulud, Neuilly. This letter was written in French and was apparently merely a social letter.
- (3) Letter in English cated February 29, 1944, from P. Graff, Ageure Francaise we Rene Number 17 Me Charras, Alger. This letter was written in English and contained nothing of particular significance.
- (4) Letter from Paris, France, cated February 5, 1946, to "Ma Cherie Petite Helene", signature illegible, possible RACUL or RANOP. This letter appeared to be personal in nature and dealt particularly with SLOTT'S former employment at Radio-Brazzaville in North Africa. The writer mentioned having dimed with a person named JOJO, at which time they discussed "The Economy of Governments." He also mentioned "Desjardin" and added that "your faithful MAURICE is still at his post." The writer mentioned that politically "everything goes very badly," and mentioned that the return of Le Bret (? illegible) is acknowledged in Paris
- (5) Letter bearing letterhead "U. S. Army Military Intelligence Service, G-2, Office of the Military Observer, French Equatorial Africa," addressed "Dear Helen" from Brazzaville, F. E. A., March 17, 1944. Signature illegible, possibly "GUY". This letter referred to the writer's transferring duty from Brazzaville to the Liaison Office, Dakar, French, West Africa, stating that he was taking over the new post for a Colonel DANIEISON "while is returning to Washington." The writer also mentioned that a Major RUSSELL B. TRIPP was replacing him at Brazzaville.



(6) A letter addressed to HELEN SCOTT in care of ALEX REUTHER, 2013 New Hampshire Avenue, NW, Washington, D. J from Buckmaster, 65 W. 11th St, NY, 11, NY, postmarked April 10, 1946. This letter apparently refers to some translation being performed by HELEN SCOTT in cooperation with HENRIETTA BUCKMASTER and MURIEL DRAPER for the WOMEN'S INTERNATIONAL DEMOCRATIO FEDERATION and relating to the Conference held by that organization in Paris, France, in 1945. This letter is being quoted as follows:

"Dear Helen:

"I talked to Murie Draper yesterday (who was incidently terribly sorry that she missed you at the Conference) and mentioned our conversation about the translation. She feels rather differently. She feels that as nearly as possible, a complete translation should be done, taking as much of the burden of editing off you as possible and transferring it to me. This does not mean a word by word translation when there are repetitions, but a retaining as nearly as possible of the flavor and impact of the reports, for our great problem is to try to get across to our critics - and they are legion the feeling and quality of the Paris conference.

"She also feels that a translation should be made of the reports and resolutions, so that the structure itself appears in the large pamphlet we are planning. However this would be the last part of your job, and she would check meanwhile, because I insisted that those translations had already been made. Summing it up, her feeling seems to be that we need as complete an account as possible. I don't know how you work; whether you naturally edit as you go along, or whether it would be easier simply to do rough translating. Whatever is easier is the answer. But more material than we discussed.

"Muriel was very anxious to hear from you the gist of your conversations with women or women's groups in Washington (what you mentioned to me over the telephone.) We need all the constructive advice we can get, and she asked if you would write as soon as possible and to her home, 322 East 58th St., NY. 22.

"I'd love to see you again, soon. I'm going to the country next week in order to get back to the book, but if you come up to New York for a few days, perhaps you could come up.

"Do let me hear from you when you have time.

ANDREW H. OLDER and his wife, ISABER OLDER, are both registered Communists in the District of Columbia in 1946. JULIA OLDER, also known as JUDY is a sister of ANDREW H. OLDER.

The newspaper column "These Charming People" in the Washington Times Herala, May 9, 1946, contains the following article regarding the OLDERS:

"BE GOOD, SWEET MAID

"Not many hostesses invite their maids to cocktails when they're entertaining, though the enticements to which housewives will go in the privacy of their homes to keep a good maid are unlimited.

"At a recent party given by Andy Older, Washington newspaperman and his wife, their maid and her husband were among the pre-dinner cocktail guests.

"The Olders had invited Lepresentative Adam Clayton Powell and his dusky night club artist wife, Hazel Scott (who will become a mother at any moment), to dinner at their/home. The Older "jewel" idolizes Hazel Scott and wanted to meet her, but not from behind a pantry door.

"So Mrs. Older invited her for cocktails. . The maid dressed to the teeth, arrived with her husband, enjoyed herself thoroughly, and, at an appropriate moment later on. slipped into the kitchen and into her maid's uniform to serve dinner.

"The moral of the story is: The maid gave notice shortly thereafter, so that formula doesn't work either!"



During the period from May 16 to 31, 1946, a mail cover was placed on the subject. However, it was not productive.

From May 16 to 31, 1946, furnished the following information concerning SILVERMAN.

On May 18, 1946, GEORGE SILVERIAN contacted an unidentified woman and told her about getting drunk at OSCAR ALTMAN's cocktail party the preceding evening. They left about 11:30 and OSCAR had to take them home. He made arrangements with this woman to meet her at a restaurant in Goorgetown and they would then go for a walk out to 4400 Reservoir Road and then have dinner.

On May 20, 1946, ANNE THITE, wife of HARRY DEXTER THITE, attempted to contact FIORENCE who is a maid at the SILVERMAN apartment, and when this was unsuccessful, she contacted Mrs. HOLLAND and attempted to obtain the address of LILLIE as she wanted to employ her as a cook. She said her husband had changed positions and she has a lot of entertaining to do.

On May 20, 1946, FRANK COE discussed with ŒORŒ SILVERIAN the appointment of the director and alternate director of the World Bank. SILVERMAN said he would have to discuss it with HARRY WHITE and expressed the opinion it would not be too attractive to HARRY but thought he would be able to manage it. COE thought it would be very complicated from HARRY's point of view. It is telieved they were referring to the possibility of WHITE's being appointed as an alternate director of the World Bank. ŒORŒ mentioned having had a lengthy conversation with OSCAR COX of Time Magazine.

On May 23, 1946, an unidentified man contacted SARAH SILVERMAN and advised he had learned from an individual of the Greek Embassy that RUSSELL YOUNG wanted to meet SILVERMAN.

On May 27, 1946, JOE SILVERMAN, brother of GEORGE, contacted SARAH SILVERMAN and advised her IRVING KAPIAN had left the Treasury Department and gone to work for MURRAY LATIMER on the annual wage study, and FRANK COE had moved, and that FRANCO may leave and go with HARRY WHITE. SARAH mentioned GEORGE is going to be out of a job soon, and he has been offered a position with the government but doesn't want it. SILVERMAN reportedly can also go with LATIMER. SARAH told JOE that DAVE JEINTRAUB, who is an assistant to IA GUARDIA at UNRRA, is probably making about \$15,000 a year.

It was subsequently determined he had a railroad reservation to Chicago on that day and a reservation from Chicago to the west coast. While in Washington he contacted Congresswoman HELEN CAHAGAN DOUGLAS in a manner indicating he was well acquainted with her. There was some indication he is involved in Russian relief project and the burden is becoming too much for him. Thile in Washington, confidential informants advised he contacted individuals at the following telephone numbers:

He also attempted to complete a long distance call to New York City, AIA 4-3550. He contacted Mr. TURNER SHITH of the Department of Justice, and there was some indication HEMES was affiliated with the American Council of Race Relations. He also contacted an individual identified only as Mr. NIIES of the White House who later visited him at his room. He contacted an individual only identified as Dr. ARTHUR FURNS at which time he discussed the Mexican labor situation and indicated he was in Washington with reference to some labor bill regretting that the man who was working with him just obtained six months' leave in order to go to Russia.

A check of the indices of the Washington Field Office indicated LAURENCE I. HEMES, Jr., is a member of the Cosmos Club, Washington, D. C., as of January 1, 1945. He is listed as a government administrator and his home address is 576 Tennyson Avenue, Palo Alto. California.



On May 21, 1946, confidential informant advised GREGORY SILVERMASTER contacted his secretary and indicated he would not be at his office on that day on account of illness. He requested her to call IARRY HEWES at the Burlington Hotel and advise him he would be unable to see him.

On the same date confidential informant advised ELIZABETH SASULY contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and discussed various social activities of theirs. HELEN indicated at this time the SILVERMASTERS were going away for the week-end and if possible they would be out of Washington every week-end this summer.

On the same date, an individual believed to be DOROTHY TAYLOR, wife of subject WILLIAM TAYLOR, contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and advised they were leaving Tashington on Thursday night and regretted they have not been able to see each other again. They are going to Vancouver through St. Paul and Chicago and expect to be back in Washington later on in the summer.

On May 22, 1946, Dr. GILMAN contacted GREGORY SILVERMASTER with reference to matters at SILVERMASTER's office. Dr. GILMAN is apparently a co-employee of SILVERMASTER.

On May 23, 1946, MARY JANE KEENEY contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and advised she hears regularly from "ANGUS," and he is much less lonely now than he was. MARY JANE KEENEY's application to join her husband has apparently not as yet been approved. She advised she is still at her old job, and she contemplates taking a couple of weeks' vacation inasmuch as she imagines she will not be employed there much longer and furthermore she needs the rest.

On May 24, 1946, HELEN SILVERIASTER contacted Mr. KORN (ALEXANDER KORN) at GRECORY SILVERNASTER's office and advised SILVERNASTER left town about 9:30 a.m. but SILVERNASTER would contact her on the following day.

On May 25, 1946, in a discussion with MARY JANE KEENEY, HEIEN SILVERMASTER stated SILVERMASTER will not return to Washington until the following Sunday, that she contemplates meeting him next Wednesday inasmuch as he is going to New York on Tuesday.

On the same evening CREGORY SILVERMASTER contacted HELEN and they discussed the purchase of the property at Harvey Cedars, particularly the home owned by one KRAUS. It was subsequently determined to be the home of GILBERT KRAUS who is vice president of the Philadelphia Record, a newspaper in Philadelphia. He indicated he was feeling better and he was arranging to go to New York on Monday afternoon, that he would contact Mrs. SILVERIASTER from New York in order that he could complete arrangements to meet her on Jednesday in Philadelphia after which they will go to the beach.

On May 26, 1946, confidential informant advised both ROBERT
FILLER and his wife JENNY contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER, and it is indicated
MILLER was at the SILVERMASTER house assisting him in painting SILVERMASTER's
room. There was some discussion between MILLER and his wife about arranging
a lease for a summer house for POLYA HABICHT.

On May 27, 1946, CREGORY SILVERNASTER advised HELEN he was staying at the Hotel New Yorker in room 1056.

On May 28, 1946, GRECORY SILVERMASTER contacted his wife and it was indicated HELEN SILVERMASTER and LUDWIG ULLMANN are leaving on the following day for Philadelphia on the 5 o'clock train. They will arrive in Philadelphia at 7:18 p.m., at the 30th Street Station and arrange to meet him at the information desk. GREGORY said he has not been feeling well and in the event he is not at the station to meet them they should come on out to ALEKANDER PORTNOFF's home and he will pick them up there.

On May 29, 1946, an individual identified by informant as ANNA BERENSON contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER, indicating she would like to reach GREGORY SILVERMASTER as soon as possible but was advised he would not be back in Washington until Sunday night. ANNA BERENSON stated she wished to discuss the housing situation with SILVERMASTER as she had occasion to talk to WYATT today and was very anxious to discuss the matter with SILVERMASTER. ANNA BERENSON was going away for a few days and was afraid WYATT might do some checking around the talk to some people. She so wished to advise SILVERUASTER and also ask his advice on other matters. She was proceeding on the premises she did not know SILVERMASTER very well because she didn't want him to be identified with the CIO because in that group one has to work with the AFL so much. She indicated she had told WYATT she had just met SILVERMASTER a couple of times but she knew several people who worked with him and the type of work he did and what a wonderful department he ran. She mentioned HARRY WHITE's name to WYATT as well as an individual identified by the informant only as BEANY BALDWIN and JACK BRYAN. HELEN at this time indicated it was perfectly all right for her to have suggested WHITE's name to WYATT, but also advised she had also better mention PETER SUDGINS who is an assistant administrator of FSA, a southern banker who was very friendly with GREGORY SILVERMASTER. HELEN advised ANNA that CREGORY had very good contacts in the AFL and his relations there were very friendly, particularly with the building trades.

ANNA BERENSON insisted that the job is now open and somebody, possibly PAT JACKSON, has already recommended an individual named SISTIN (phonetic), but ANNA BERENSON further indicated she was under the impression she stopped that, and that she only mentioned that to show that WYATT is very susceptible.

On Way 29, 1946, informant advised LUDVIG ULLMANN contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and indicated he saw PETE HUDGINS and fixed up the matter with him, that he was very nice about it.

Physical Surveillance

Special Agents CARL VOELKER and JOHN BARRON conducted a physical surveillance on subject at his home on May 24, 1946, commencing at 9:20 a.m. At 9:45 a.m., the subject in his automobile, a 1941 Chrysler, license 105-064, proceeded north on Connecticut Avenue to Baltimore, Maryland, via route 193, 97, 182, and 29. At approximately 11:20 a.m., he proceeded on route 40 toward New Castle, Delaware. He proceeded to Pennsville, New Jersey, via Philadelphia and then southeast on New Jersey route 48 towards Atlantic City. He arrived at Manahawkin, New Jersey, at 4 p.m. He proceeded out Bay Avenue to an island known as Long Beach Island.

On arriving at the island, subject turned north still on Bay Avenue and proceeded through a settlement known as Surf City to Harvey Cedars. He proceeded north on Bay Avenue to 84th Street and turned right one block and stopped in front of the last house on the right side (south side of 84th Street at the Ocean). An elderly gray-haired man, subsequently identified as ALEXANDER PORTNOFF, emerged from the house and greeted subject very cordially. The physical surveillance was relinquished to special agents of the Newark Field Office.

By letter dated June 10, 1946, the Newark Field Office advised that they commenced the surveillance of subject at 8 a.m., May 25, 1946, that very little activity on the part of subject was noted on that day. He was observed to drive to the KRAUS house and look over his property. No particular activity was noted until May 27, 1946, at 12:50 p.m., when subject, accompanied by two other individuals, left Long Beach Island in subject's automobile. One of these individuals was identified as ALEXANDER PORTNOFF, and they drove to the residence at 948 Clinton Street, Fhiladelphia, at which time the surveillance was relinquished to agents of the Fhiladelphia Field Office.

On May 27, 1946, at 4:05 p.m., SILVERMASTER and PORTNOFF left the PORTNOFF house and after dining at Horn and Hardart's Restaurant on 11th and Chestnut Streets went to Broad Street Station of the Pennsylvania Railroad where SILVERMASTER purchased a ticket for New York and boarded a train at 5 p.m. The train arrived at New York at 6:50 p.m., where the surveillance was surrendered to agents of the New York Office.

SILVERMASTER returned to Philadelphia on May 29, 1946, at 4:45 p.m., and went immediately by taxi to FORTNOFF's home and visited in rapid succession two nearby restaurants and a hotel returning to the house at 5:45 p.m. It was not possible to determine whether he contacted anyone at these places.

At 8:13 p.m., HELEN SILVER: ASTER and LUDWIG ULL: ANN arrived at the 30th Street Pennsylvania Railroad Station from Washington, D. C. They took a taxi to PORTNOFF's home arriving there about 8:35 p.m. At 9 p.m., GREGORY and

HELEN SILVERMASTER and LUDWIG ULLMANN left the PORTNOFF home, entered SILVERMASTER's car which had been parked in front of the residence since

SILVERMASTER's car which had been parked in front of the residence since he had driven in from Harvey Cedars two days previously, and drove to Harvey Cedars, New Jersey, arriving at 11:25 p.m. Surveillance was surrendered to agents of the Newark Field Office on May 30, 1946, at 9 a.m.

No activity was observed on the part of subject on May 30, 1946.

At 6:30 p.m., June 2, 1946, a spot check surveillance for subject SILVERMASTER was resumed by Special Agents MAUPITZ E. GAHLON and CHARLES L. SMITH. At that time subject's car was not observed at the summer home of the PORTNOFFS. Frequent checks were made until midnight and at no time was subject's automobile observed in the vicinity of this address.

At 11:45 p.m., June 2, 1946, Special Agent S. H. MENDELSOHN of the Newark Office telephonically advised Special Agent O. G. MEDLER of the Washington Field Office that, according to all indications, subject SILVERNASTER had returned to Washington, D. C.

The following information was developed during the course of this surveillance.

Special Agent MICHAEL J. CCNNOLLY interviewed SAM LEARS, postmaster at Harvey Cedars, New Jersey, who stated that ALEXANDER PORTNOFF is a sculptor and his wife is a registered pharmacist. They both are permanent residents in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and have received very little mail at their summer home in Harvey Cedars. Mr. LEARS advised the KRAUS house mentioned is the summer home of GILBERT KRAUS who is vice president of the Philadelphia Record. LEARS also mentioned the real estate dealer by the name of CANETTI is M. A CANETTI whom LEARS described as being unreliable to contact.

During the course of the surveillance maintained by Agents GAHLON and SMITH, it was observed there were two Pennsylvania cars parked in front of the PORTNOFF home in Harvey Cedars, New Jersey. The first of these was a gray Chevrolet having 1946 Pennsylvania license K 6159. The second was a black Ford coupe having 1946 Pennsylvania license R 9485. Due to the nature of the surveillance and the surrounding area, it was impossible to obtain any descriptive data concerning the occupants of either of these cars.

On May 26, Colonel END.URL arrived in Mashington. He got in touch with a woman named L.RY and told her he expected to drive back to New York City the following day. He asked L.RY to get in touch with a Lr. GLICK (ph) in New York and tell him that he, Colonel ERDEUR, intended to see him about 4:00 p.m. on the following day or early on Tuesday. HELEN TENNEY also spoke with LLRY and asked her to make an appointment for her for Saturday, the 15th LLRY said she would make an appointment for both Colonel ERDEURL and PELEN TENNEY &



The following investigation covers the period from May 16th through May 31, inclusive.



On May 16, 1946 a physical surveillance was conducted by Special agent E. L. FUOSS on MAVID R. WHL and it was observed that at 11.30 M WHL and an unidentified man proceeded to the Department of Interior and their exact destination was undetermined. At 2.10 PM THE left the Interior Building and proceeded to his office. No other activity was observed that day.

This individual then boarded the Riverdale Streetcar at Rhode Island avenue and 4th Street, NE and rode to Hills Avenue and Rhode Island avenue, departed from the streetcar and entered a bakery shop. Several minutes later this individual was observed to again board a Riverdale Streetcar and rode to Branchville, Maryland where he departed and proceeded to thumb a ride in a passing automobile which eventually brought him to Greenbelt, Maryland. This individual then walked from the car and entered his house at 19 North Ridge Road Avenue, Greenbelt, Maryland. The identity of the occupant of the above address was obtained from the Greenbelt Police Department which listed the occupant as SHUEL TAKEISEROTH.

On May 28, 1916 the same agent observed THL depart from his office at 12.10 PM and proceed to room 112 of the State Department, the office of T. T. CH.PMIN, Jr. It was ascertained that THL desired to see in THLIM LINGER who was not in at that time. THL proceeded to leave the State Department and went directly to his office at 1706 G Street. At 12.40 PM THL departed from his office, entered his car which was parked nearby and drove to Ontario and Columbia Roads where he parked and walked in the direction of Columbia Road. His destination was not determined. It 2.15 PM THL was observed to return to his car and proceed to drive to E Street between 17th and 18th NT where he parked the car and then proceeded to his office.

A check of the indices of the Tashington Field Division regarding SITUEL EISEROTH revealed that on June 25, 1941 TEISEROTH was the subject of an Internal Security-C Case and that at that time he was employed by the Congressional Library, Tashington, D.C. and was considered to be very revolutionary in his views and an ardent admirer of the Russian form of Government. It was further reflected that TEISEROTH was considered to be

violently opposed to the constitutional form of government presently in existence in this country and was a very close associate of FREDERICK A. SLOSSON, also with the Library of Congress and allegedly a Communist.

The files also reflected under the case entitled: Internal Security, Hatch Act" report dated October 2, 1941 that SAF WEISHROTH was born December 6, 1911 in New York City, that he was an american citizen married, attended Columbia University School of Engineering for two years, that he was employed in the Survey of Federal Archives, Old Post Office, New York City, 1936 to September, 1937 and was employed by the Library of Congress, Washington, D.C. September, 1937. The file reflected that a confidential source listed "EISEROTH on the indices of the American Peace Mobilization.

Investigation at this time failed to disclose membership in the above mentioned organization or any other subversive activity.

According to the records of the rental office at Greenbelt, Maryland which were checked by Special agent FOUSS Nay 31, 1946 EISEROTH was listed as of May, 1943 employed by the ar Production Board as Industrial Specialist, Radio and Retail Section. As of April 3, 1944 he was listed as Communication analyst at the approximately salary of 3800 to 4400. The records further reflected EISEROTH as being unemployed since approximately November, 1945. He continues to pay his rent but his source of income is not known to the Manager of the Greenbelt Rental Office. The records reflected that in 1938 while employed with the Library of Congress he moved from 221 Ingraham Street, No. Ashington, D.C. to his present address in Greenbelt, Earyland.

During the period from May 15 to June 1, 1946, Informant advised as follows:

PY D

On May 17th, EDNA GASS contacted MARY WHEELER and stated that she had learned from MARY JANE CHITE that DON WHEELER is going to Chicago and "that DON would stay at the WHITES while he is in Chicago; that they have a house there into which they will move May 20th. EDNA advised MARY MEELER that DICK WHITE worked for the Chicago Housing Authority, telephone Harrison 9660, and that MARY JEAN CHITE is working for the National Housing Authority, with telephone Randolph 8911. Apparently the WHITES are not sure that they will remain in Chicago, for EDNA has advised if plans for the WHITES don't go according to their satisfaction, that the WHITES will return to Washington in the fall of 1946. EDNA GASS also stated that OSCAP CASS, her husband, wants MARY to know that DON MEELER should tell DICK HITE in Chicago that DICK can come back and work for TOM WORKORAN, Washington Attorney, as DUNCAN LEE is doing now.

The same source advised that MARY WHEELER sent a telegram on May 18 to Mr. and Mrs. RICHARD WATT at 138 Woodland, Winnetka, Illinois, and that in this wire she advised the WATTS that she and DON would be very happy to stay with the WATT family and requested that the Shoreland Reservation for the WHEELER family be cancelled.

On May 20th, Mrs. CREENFIELD, of the Independent Voters League organization, contacted MARY WHEELER and tried to interest MARY in their forthcoming program, but MARY said that she and DON WHEELER are leaving for a vacation on the West Coast in three weeks and cannot take a lead in this type of work until fall of 1946.

On May 22, MARY THEELER contacted MARION/COLEMAN and made reference to getting cigarettes for Col. GEORGE THEELER, MARY's brother-in-law, who is in Berlin, in order that GEORGE THEELER can trade the cigarettes for oriental rugs which he will ship to the United States. MARY made reference to the fact that it is illegal to traffic in post exchange goods, but that HUNTER MORRISON advised her that it is legal to use the cigarettes with the Federal stamp on them. MARY said that the University in Chicago has not yet offered DON WHEELER a job, and he is not sure he will take it even if it is offered to him.

On May 23, MARY THEFIER contacted WANDA GRAVES at the Army Map Service Purchasing Department, to see if WANDA cared to rent the THEFIERS' house this summer while the WHEELERS were away. WANDA declined the offer. MARY advised

they will leave on June 8th, and that DON's sister, MARGERET JEAN DANIELSON, and her daughter, NANCY, are going with them. MARY advised WANDAY CRAVES that DON HEELER's job here in the Government is at an end (OSS) Apparently MARY WHEELER met WANDA GRAVES while MARY was an employee at the Army Map Service.

On May 23d, GERTRUDE HURNEY contacted MARY WHEELER regarding the renting of the MARY THEELER home for this summer. GERTRUDE and her husband, TOM, will be out to see the THEELERS on May 24th to discuss the renting of the house.

On May 25, MARIAN COLEMAN contacted MARY WHEELER and asked if MARY had heard from ISHBELL IEE. MARY said that ISHBELL had gotten in touch with her and will call for MARY and DON and bring them over to the COLEMANS' residence that evening. MARY advised that ISHBELL's mother, Mrs. GIBB, is not coming and feels conscious about going out with people "like us." MARION remarked to MARY to be sure to bring the letter.

On May 28th, MARY THEELER advised MARIAN COLEMAN that she would rent her house to a Navy doctor who would just stay there for the summer. MARY also advised that she received a letter from MARGARET JEAN DANIELSON, DON's sister, who is going to drive out to visit the WHEELERS, and who will arrive with her daughter, NANCY, in Washington on June 7th. MARY said that it was good to see DUNCAN and ISHBELL LEE again for they would not be able to see them otherwise before they left. MARY also advised at this time that SAM and PAULAARSENICSBERG would have dinner with them on May 29th at the WHEELER's residence.

On the same date, DOROTHY/TOOK attempted to reach MARY MEELER. DOROTHY left a message for MARY to contact her at EMerson 3053 that evening.

On May 31st, Operator No. 25 at REpublic 4355 left a message for DON THEELER to contact that operator, and, on the same date at 3:00 p. m., the same operator attempted to reach DON WHEELER, advising that they have two telegrams for him, one at 2:10 and the other at 3:00 o'clock.

Inquiry to determine the identity of HUNTER MORRISON, who has been a frequent contact in the last thirty days of DONALD and MARY THEELER, has revealed that HUNTER MORRISON was discharged from the Army at Ft. Mcade, maryland on or about March 30, 1946; that for a time immediately thereafter he was residing with one PHIL MAYER in Colonial Village, Arlington, Virginia, and that sometime later, he resided with one MIKE HOKE, telephone number and that sometime later, he resided with one MIKE HOKE at the ADams 3154. It is believed that he is still residing with MIKE HOKE at the above telephone number.


HELEN TENNEY, when contacting a woman known only as DUTCH, on March 25, 1946, advised DUTCH that HUNTER's address was 662 Milledge Circle, Athens, Georgia.

Inquiry regarding the identity and activities of CHARLES and MATHDA MCKINLEY, who first came to the attention of this office when they attended a dinner party at the WHEELER residence on May 10, 1946, revealed that they have resided at the Carolyn Apartments, 2500 Q Street, Washington, D. C.; that they are from 6230 Southeast 36th Street, Portland, Oregon.

Mrs. MARTHA McCOMINCHEY, clerk at the Carolyn Apartments, advised that they, the McKINLEYS, occupied hotel apartment No. 538 on those premises from May 3, 1946 until May 26th, when they suddenly vacated, advising they were returning to Portland, Oregon. While occupying Apartment 538, CHARLES McKINLEY received a large amount of correspondence believed to be of a business nature. According to this source, the McKINLEYS did not associate with any of the other tenants in this building, and only on their day of departure were they seen in the company of any other persons. Adequate descriptions could not be obtained. Mrs. McCOMANGHEY advised that she would be willing to contact the resident manager, whom she suggested not be contacted by an agent due to her personality, whereby she would be able to determine in what manner the McKINLEYS were able to obtain so readily apartment space in this exclusive apartment building. It is noted that HELEN TENNEY also resides at the Carolyn Apartments.

Inquiry was made to determine the identity of one J. G. STONE, of 1924 Park Road, N. W., who corresponded with DONAID THEELER on December 8, 1945. Inquiry at the Credit Bureau revealed that JAMES G. STONE and wife, VERA, or ANNIE, resided at 1924 Park Road, N. W., Washington, D. C. He is age fifty-five, white, and has two children, and has been a resident of Washington, D. C. for many years and moved to his present address in November, 1930, which premises he owns. Previously, he resided at 1748 Kenyon Street, N. W., 1520 Rhode Island, N. W., and 1916 17th Street, N. W. He is employed as a Real Estate broker, is licensed in the District of Columbia, and shares office space in the Southern Building with IEVINE P. HANDY and WILLIAM P. H. KIELER, who are in the same business. He was formerly manager of the local

agency for the Atlantic Insurance Company in the same building, which job netted him a salary of 15,000 a year from 1927 to 1941. He was at one time employed in the Treasury Department and his highly regarded in Real Estate Circles. He has a checking account at the Liberty National Bank. No further investigation is being afforded JAMES G. VSTONE, inasmuch as his contact with WHEELER probably was legitimate.

Regarding CERTRUDE HURNEY, who is referred to by informant May 23 as having contacted MARY THEELER, the Washington Field Office indices revealed that GERTRUDE HURNEY is a member of the Tashington Book Shop, is a contact of ESTAR PASKOFF, CHA LOTTE GOLD, and others active with the Washington Book Shop. She is not a member of the Communist Party, but affiliated and associate d with Party members. She had a meeting at her house on February 21, 1944 of Communist Party members, and on May 15, 1944 contacted CARL TORGOFF and advised that she would contact BELLA RODMAN at the Russian War Relief regarding their bookkeeping system. She resides at 6202 12th Street, N. W., Washington. At the Washington Book Shop, she was in contact with SARLAROWAT and invited him to attend a Board meeting on May 2, 1944. She has had contact with ELIZABETH SEARLE at Communist Party headquarters on January 31, 1944.

With reference to the address 1018 Girard Street, Apartment 22, Washington, D. C., which is referred to by Informant on March 18, 1946, it is believed that this reference contact is not associated with the DON by WHEELER family.

There is no Washington Field Office reference to JOHN F. PRICE, of the above address; however, inquiry at the Credit Bureau revealed that PRICE is thirty-three years of age, a negro, and his wife's name is EDITH. EDITH is from Culpeper, Virginia, and PRICE is from West Point, Mississippi. He has been employed by the Commercial Luncheon Room, 724 18th Street, N. W., and, according to the janitor at 1018 Gerard Street, PRICE is presently employed at the Telephone Company since about May 28, 1946.

Inasmuch as it is believed that PRICE is not identical with any THEELER contacts, no further inquiries are being made regarding this person.

May 16, 1946

On the morning of this date ANNE WHITE indicated WHITE was on his way to his office and Mr. BERNSTEIN was bringing him down.

Subsequently on this date THITE advised ANNE he would go to the Wardman Park Hotel about 6 o'clock and be there for an hour or so.

May 17, 1946

On the morning of this date BERNICE advised WHITE she would pick him up about 8:40. This woman is believed to be BERNICE CRNSTEIN, wife of Colonel BERNIE BERNSTEIN.

May 18, 1946

One REBA LEWIS contacted ANNE WHITE mentioning she and ROGER may visit ANNE that afternoon if he returns from Baltimore. Apparently he is to take a position on the staff at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore.

Subsequently, REBA indicated ROCER had returned but it was too late to visit. He told her he had wonderful time at the place of ANNE's brother-in-law in Boston.

On this date BERNIE BERNSTEIN invited WHITE to ride downtown which offer WHITE declined. BERNIE inquired if WHITE had anything on his mind the previous evening when he called. WHITE stated no, they would have visited the BERNSTEINS had they been home. BERNIE inquired as to the length of some meeting, and WHITE said it lasted until 5:30 or 5:45 p.m. BERNIE asked if WHITE made any progress in developing his liaison with UN as it is a good thing to have and furnishes WHITE an excuse to visit New York. BERNIE mentioned having lunch the previous day with one SPAVELLY or BRADIET SMITH (phonetic) who told him WHITE was handling the situation well.

WHITE suggested SMITH had been apple-polishing, and BERNSTEIN said
he did not know whether it was that or whether he was looking for some friend
on the Russian issue. BERNSTEIN stated he had lunch with two of them and
they stated it was a kind of good thing negotiations had broken down in Paris,
and he thought this is the way they feel, that they are "practically patting
their bellies that the Americans are following such a close policy with the

British." WHITE commented, "They are very consistent, yeah, they are being very consistent," and mentioned the matter has never come up for discussion along those lines.

May 19, 1946

On the morning of this date, ANNE WHITE contacted DOGOTHY TAYLOR, wife of subject TAYLOR, Washington Hotel, room 430, and arranged for the wHITES to pick them up for a trip to the park. (This was a Sunday morning.)

SALL MILLER contacted WHITE who stated he had wanted to get in touch with MILLER and get his advice as he was confronted with making a decision. WHITE stated the head of the fund asked him to be his deputy which had certain advantages but would compel relinquishing the position of executive director. He indicated it was too late as he had made the decision deciding against it because he has a lot of power and authority where he is, but as an employee would not have the same opportunity to shape policy.

WHITE continued that he would have had more authority over the organization, the hiring of people, and the details in creating a good organization; in fact, would probably have been running it but he would not have been on the board of directors and would not be a U. S. representative.

WHITE mentioned he would not have had any vote except under certain situations and a new director would have been appointed, and WHITE would not know what his attitude would be. MILLER inquired whether VINSON would have liked for WHITE to have accepted the post, and WHITE stated he was not sure, that he did not know. They agreed to have a little talk and WHITE indicated he would pick MILLER and EVELYN up after getting BILL TAYLOR and his kid.

On the afternoon of this date, ANNE WHITE was contacted by Mrs.

MONTEROS (phonetic) in connection with dinner invitation extended the WHITES
for that night. (It is believed Mrs. MONTEROS may be the wife of Mexican
Ambassador ANTONIO/ESPINOS/DE/IOS/MONTEROS.)

May 20, 1946

ANNE WHITE told FRANCES EDELSTEIN they had dinner at the mexican Embassy and had a nice time except someone was there whom ANNE does not like. ANNE inquired if TERRITOHER would know any cooks ANNE could get for a short time. FRANCES mentioned RUTH GRUBER had visited her the previous day having come down to Washington for two or three days to see what she could do toward furthering that Palestine program.

On the evening of this date, RUTH GRUBER contacted ANNE THITE advising she would be in town until Friday morning when she would return to New York She said the New York Post had requested her to stay on as world-wide roving

correspondent, and she wanted to consider the assignment. RUTH-stated for the next six weeks she wanted to assist in implementing the report and would be commuting between New York and Washington until they got the thing pushed through. She said she felt if they didn't get it through within six weeks it would be a dead duck because by then the British would have made up their minds not to be in it and the United States would follow. RUTH understood the President was 100 per cent behind it and had not changed his mind. She feels the 100,000 Jews would have to go in which is very encouraging. stated they would spearhead the drive to implement the report and this was the most important thing she could do now. ANNE made arrangements for lunch with GRUBER on May 22, 1946.

May 21, 1946

Nothing of value was furnished by informant. ANNE engaged in a conversation with one LOTTIE CASKINS, 1733 20th Street, phone North 9611, concerning employing LOTTIE as part-time cook.

May 22, 1946

On the night of this date EVELYN MILLER advised ANNE HHITE her brother had seen ABE WOLFSON and the WOLFSONS sent their regards. She indicated her husband SAli had gone.

May 23, 1946

Nothing of interest was furnished by informant. (W) (W)

May 24, 1946

On May 24, 1946, HITE and APPNE discussed contacting FELTUS and offering an apology. WHITE stated never mind he would be in town on many other occasions, and they could have him out to dinner. This conversation apparently concerned RANDOLPH TELTUS. WHITE stated he was awaiting a call from ŒORŒ concerning lunched. The identity of ŒORŒ is not known.

May 25, 26, 1946

Nothing of importance was learned from informant except WHITE has authorized one Mr. BREJER, Adlied Realty Company, to advertise WIITE's house for sale.

May 27, 1946

ANNE WHITE advised FRANCES EDELSTEIN her daughter JOAN had been She stated HENRIETTA KLOTZ's maid (HELEN ?) admitted to Barnard College.

is coming to help her do some entertaining.

On the same date one IRVING contacted ANNE indicating he was on his way from Annapolis and would have dinner with the WHITES. It is believed this is IRVINGFURST of Richmond, Virginia, mentioned previously in these reports.

Informant furnished no information of value.

May 29, 1946

Informant advised IRVING FURST again visited the WHITE residence for dinner and subsequently communicated with his wife in Richmond, Virginia.

May 30, 1946

No information of value was obtained from informant.

May 31, 1946

WHITE and his wife discussed entertaining some officials mentioning BRUNS, French Financial Mission, and LA GENTIL, possibly EUGENE LA CENTIL, one of the founders of France Forever. ANNE stated she did not wish to invite the Mexicans, Chileans or Argentineans along with Chinese and French. She said the French and Chinese get along well. ANNE indicated later they could have KOO, and CHEN, possibly CHEN CHIR MAI, counselor, Broadmoor Hotel, and SANTOS (TILIAS (phonetic).

Reference is made to conversation on May 11, 1946, between ANNE WHITE and one MARIE WELLER who indicated she was in Washington for a conference and would return on Monday.

The indices of the Washington Field Office were searched without positively identifying this individual. The files reflect on February 18, indicated one MARIE KELLER, 1711 I Street, N. W., phone 1944, informant District 7094,

This person may possibly be identical with the person who con-

tacted Mrs. WHITE.

Reference is made to the conversation on April 25, 1946, between HARRY WHITE and one DAVE DELMAN who stated he was talking with LUXFORD (ANSEL F. LUXFORD, Office of the Secretary of Treasury). DAVE indicated he


The files of the Washington Field Office contain files on one DAVID NELMAN who is the subject of a hatch act investigation in 1942, as well as an employee investigation for a position in the Office of Emergency Management. This individual was reported by the Special House Committee to Investigate un-American Activities as being a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the National Lawyers Guild. At that time a confidential informant reported DEIMAN's name did appear on the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.

At the time DELMAN was employed as senior attorney, Food Products Section, Legal Division, Office of Price Administration. Previously he had been employed by the Securities Exchange Commission from June 18, 1941, to January 26, 1942. He is described as having been born January 15, 1909, in New York City where he attended Boys High School, Brooklyn; City College (B. A. 1929); Columbia Law School (LL. B. in 1936); and Graduate School of Economics, Columbia University, from 1938 to 1940. He was married and at the time of investigation resided at 3011 Cntario Road, N. W. His legal address was 1419 Foster Avenue, Brooklyn, New York.

The current issue of the Congressional Directory includes one DAVID DELMAN, described as clerk of the Senate Banking and Currency Committee, 360h David Street, N. W. The 1943 city directory reflected DAVID DELMAN, residence 3011 Ontario Road. The same directory listed Mrs. ELIZABETH DELMAN as secretary Washington League of Women Shoppers, 3011 Ontario Road, N. W.

The records of the Special Committee on un-American Activities, MARTIN DIES, Chairman, reflected one DAVID DELMAN, 2309 65th Street, Brooklyn, New York, signed the 1939-1940 Communist Party petition for the New York state and city elections. However, there is no indication this individual is identical with the above named.
