A long-term vision for North America in a Chairmen Statement of the Independent Task Force on the Future of North America was sponsored by the **Council on Foreign Relations** in association with the **Consejo Mexicano de Asuntos Internacionales** and the **Canadian Council of Chief Executives**

The final report of the task force put forward 39 specific recommendations aimed at making North America a single economic space, and institutionalizing the North American partnership.

"In March 2005, the leaders of Canada, the United States and Mexico launched the Security and Prosperity Partnership of North America, a comprehensive agreement that advances the North American agenda."
